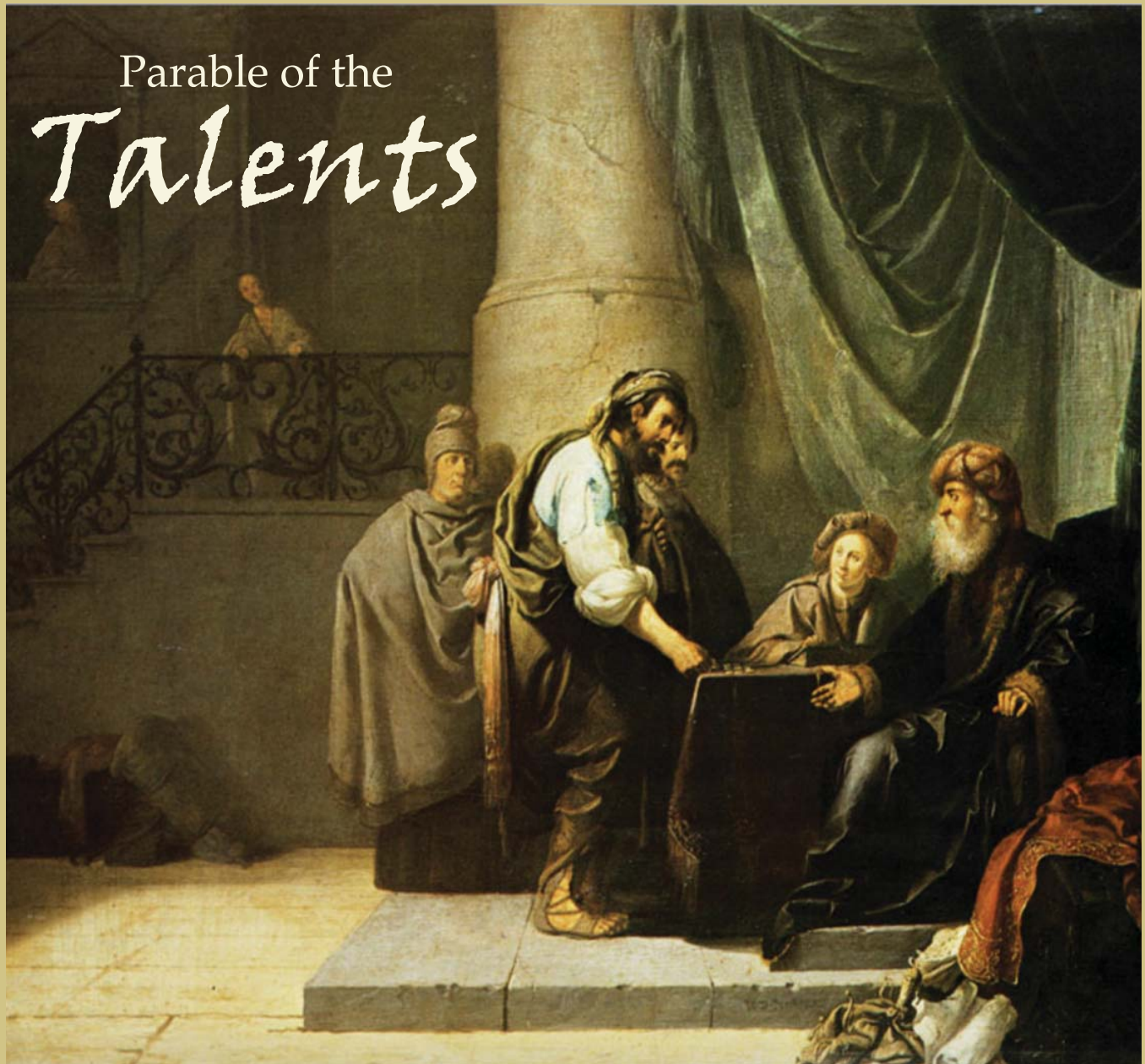

## PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I'm sure many of you are finalizing your Thanksgiving plans. I hope you can join us for Mass on Thanksgiving Day. For those who have to get on the road early, we have Mass at 6:30 a.m. We will also have Mass at 9:00 a.m. "Eucharist" is a Greek word which means: to give thanks. This is the best way to give thanks for all God's blessings when we gather together for Holy Eucharist.

This Sunday, the first Scripture reading (Proverbs 31:10-13, 19-20, 30-31) seems to be about marriage. However, another theme seems to concentrate on all the talents this wife has. The Lord has blessed her with many talents and she is making the most of them. She is industrious: "She obtains wool and flax and works with loving hands ... to the distaff, and her fingers ply the spindle." She is charitable: "She reaches out her hand to the poor, and extends her arms to the needy." She "fears the Lord," which means she is a true believer who spends time in prayer and in showing reverence and honor to God. She recognizes that everything she has is a gift from God and she makes the most of these gifts.

This ties in with today's Gospel (Matthew 25:14-30) in which Jesus tells the parable of the man going on a journey who entrusted his possessions to his servants in the form of talents, which were coins that had a high value. We use the same word to describe something we're good at doing. Notice what happens in the parable. Two of the servants right away trade with the talents and double the amount. The third one does nothing except bury his master's money. That's the point Jesus makes, two of them make use of the gifts or talents they were given. Notice that the master called the third one "lazy" for doing nothing with his talent. Even if he had made a little bit of interest in the bank he would have been happy.

The Lord blesses us with many wonderful talents but they're worthless if we leave them dormant. Remember how the parable began, "a man going on a journey called in his servants and entrusted his possessions to them." (Matthew 25:14) Our talents belong to the Lord and he has entrusted his possessions to us. We are called to make the most of these talents. We are called to be generous with them. We are called to share the Lord's possessions with those around us. To make this clearer, read next week's Gospel passage which is the Last Judgment. (Matthew 25: 31-46) This will go right to the point of what we need to do with our God-given gifts and talents.

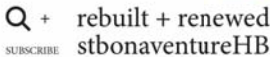

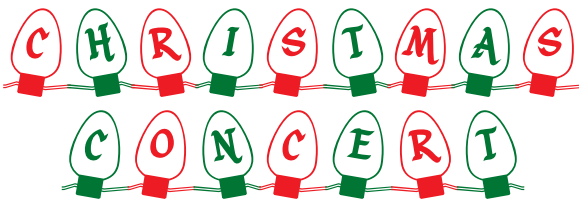

### Share The Journey

Pope Francis has launched a two-year global migration awareness campaign, calling the Church around the world to show our love for our immigrant and refugee neighbors. The global *Share the Journey* campaign focuses in the United States on the call to Love Your Neighbor. The U.S. Catholic Bishops want to inspire communities to learn more about our brothers and sisters and what the Church teaches about migrants and refugees. They encourage communities to share their support through social media, and to take action to promote respect for the dignity of every person. The Church's teaching on immigration is very clear and is rooted first and foremost in the dignity of the human person. While it does not directly correlate to every public policy decision, it does clearly rule as out-of-bounds any kind of language that seeks to segment and separate God's people. Sadly, the language of exclusion has dominated much of our debate around this issue.

What is that teaching? Well, as with all doctrine it begins with God. The story of God is the ultimate migration story, a migrant people following a migrant God. As our Jewish sisters and brothers remind us, welcoming the stranger is the most repeated theme in Scripture. God reminds the people: "You shall treat the stranger who resides with you no differently than the native born among you; you shall love the stranger as yourself; for you too were once strangers in the land of Egypt" (Leviticus 19:34).

For Christians, in the ultimate migration God became man and dwelt among us. Jesus the Son is born to a family that shortly thereafter flees to Egypt under threat of King Herod. Even upon return to their homeland, they lived under occupation of a foreign power. Jesus taught welcome of the stranger as a criterion for the final judgment. Jesus, the Good News tells us, lived, died, and rose from the dead that we might have life. The Son returns to the Father, journeying back to Heaven that he might eventually bring us — his migrant people — and the whole world with him. ..."

### TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

El 23 de noviembre de 1927, un pelotón de soldados conducía al jesuita mexicano Miguel Agustín Pro Juárez al paredón de fusilamiento. Uno de ellos le susurraba "perdóneme". Miguel le respondió que no sólo lo perdonaba, sino que le daba las gracias por darle la oportunidad de dar testimonio de su fe derramando su sangre por Cristo. Días antes había sido arrestado y acusado de intento de asesinato contra el presidente mexicano Álvaro Obregón. En realidad su delito era el de bautizar niños, bendecir matrimonios, llevar la comunión a los enfermos y escuchar la confesión de los arrepentidos. Miguelito nació en 1891 y entró al noviciado jesuita en 1914, al mismo tiempo que el gobierno mexicano comenzaba una persecución en contra de la Iglesia. Debido a esta situación, Miguel tuvo que hacer su formación religiosa fuera de México. Apenas pudo, regresó a su nación como sacerdote e hizo su pastoral a escondidas, sabiendo muy bien que podía ser martirizado.

Miguel decía a sus amigos que al morir iría al cielo y si se encontraba con santos resacos, bailarían un jarabe tapatío hasta hacerles sonreír para Cristo Rey. —Fray Gilberto Cavazos-Glz, OFM, © J. S. Paluch Co., Inc.
