## PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Today is the feast day in honor of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. Even though Jesus was the Son of God, he honored his mother, Mary, and even though God is the Father of Jesus, he still honored his foster-father, Joseph. "He stores up riches who reveres his mother. Whoever honors his father is gladdened by children, and when he prays, is heard. Whoever reveres his father will live a long life; he who obeys his father brings comfort to his mother" (Sirach 3:4-6).

The Gospel reading today tells us that Joseph and Mary devoutly practiced their faith in God and followed the law of God, "They took him (Jesus) up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord, just as it is written in the law of the Lord" (Luke 2:22-23).

When you had your children baptized, you made a solemn promise before God. The priest asked you, "You have asked to have your child baptized. In doing so you are accepting the responsibility of training him in the practice of the faith. It will be your duty to bring him/her up to keep God's commandments as Christ taught us, by loving God and our neighbor. Do you clearly understand what you are undertaking?" And you and your spouse responded, "We do." "Loving God" means you spend time with the Lord. Loving God means you pray to the Lord, especially through participating in Sunday Mass with your children. If your children witness that faith in the Lord is important to you, it will be important to them.

Through the intercession of the Holy Family, please pray to the Lord, to help you share the faith with your family. Live the words of St. Paul, "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, as in all wisdom you teach and admonish one another, singing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs with gratitude in your hearts to God. And whatever you do, in word or in deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him" (Colossians 3:16-17).

May the Lord bless you and your family throughout the New Year.

The title "Mother of God" is from the Greek "theotokos" literally translated "God-bearer." Theotokos was adopted at the Ecumenical Council at Ephesus as a way to assert the divinity of Christ. This oldest feast of Mary celebrates Mary's role in always directing the believer toward her Son.

## NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER *for* PEACE

In 2002 the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) voted to designate January 1, the Solemnity of Mary, The Holy Mother of God, as a National Day of Prayer for Peace. On January 1 we ask Mary, our Mother and Mother of the Church, to intercede for us as her children.



Mary is the model believer who believed the unfathomable message of Gabriel, endured the initial doubt of Joseph and the exile in Egypt, witnessed the events of Christ's public life, and was tried at the foot of the cross. We, as members of Christ, with Mary as our Mother and Model, are called to the same faith, now in the grim reality of war, of terrorism, of hatred, of unrestrained violence and the threat of biological attacks.

We may feel powerless in the face of so much real and potential evil, but we cannot allow ourselves the luxury of powerlessness. In doing so we shortchange the power of God who hears our prayer and works through us. We are called to believe that God has a plan for us and that God's plan will prevail. We are also called to collaborate in that plan by our own prayer made in union with Christ, our Head, by our efforts to promote peace with those whose lives intersect with ours.

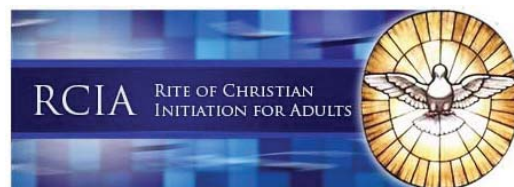

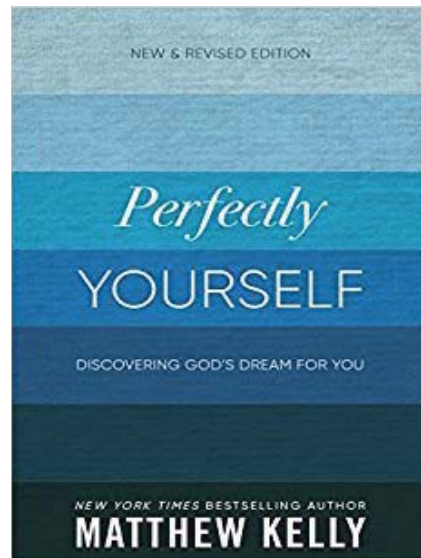
