PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We are now in the liturgical season of Ordinary Time. This season occurs before and after the seasons of Advent-Christmas and Lent-Easter. It allows us time to journey with the Lord through the Holy Scriptures helping us come to know him. In fact, that is what Jesus said to two new disciples in today's Gospel reading when they asked him where he was staying. Jesus said to them, "Come, and you will see" (John 1:39).

Let's start with the First Reading for this Second Sunday in Ordinary Time. (1 Samuel 3:3-10,19) Young Samuel was dedicated to the Lord by his mother. To learn more about this, read the first three chapters of 1 Samuel. One night while young Samuel was asleep in the Temple and the Lord called to him, Samuel thought it was Eli the priest who had called him. Three times Samuel went to Eli, "Here I am. You called me." Three times Eli told him, "I did not call you." But then Eli realized the Lord was calling him. He told Samuel that the next time he heard the call he was to say, "Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening." The Lord called a fourth time and now Samuel knew what to say, "Speak, Lord, your servant is listening." And Samuel for the rest of his life, listened and did what the Lord wanted.

This is not just for Samuel. We are called to pray this constantly, "Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening." You may also want to pray the response to Psalm 40, "Here am I, Lord, I come to do your will."

In today's Gospel reading (John 1:35-42), John the Baptist pointed out Jesus to two of his disciples, "Behold, the Lamb of God." John had prepared them well for the coming of the Lord and now they followed the Lamb of God. Jesus asked them, "What are you looking for?" They responded, "Rabbi (Teacher), where are you staying?" Jesus said, "Come, and you will see." They stayed with him that day. This is what we need to do. Stay with Jesus. Pray with Jesus. Read and pray the Holy Scriptures. Pray within the Mass. Come to know Jesus. We spend more time playing with our phones than we spend praying with Jesus.

This has to change. "Here am I, Lord, I come to do your will." "Speak, Lord, your servant is listening."

Và ông dẫn anh mình tới Chúa Giêsu. Chúa Giêsu nhìn Simon và nói: 'Người là Simon, con ông Gioan, người sẽ được gọi là Kêpha, nghĩa là Đá'."



Thánh Macrina - Thánh Macrina là bà nội của Thánh Basil Cả mà chúng ta mừng kính vào ngày 2-1. Dường như Thánh Macrina đã nuôi dưỡng Thánh Basil Cả và khi lớn lên thánh nhân đã không ngớt lời ca tụng công việc lành phúc đức của bà nội. Đặc biệt, thánh nhân đã nhắc đến việc giáo dục đức tin của bà khi thánh nhân còn nhỏ. Thánh Macrina và chồng đã phải trả một giá rất đắt khi theo Đức Kitô. Trong thời kỳ bách hại của các hoàng đế La Mã Galerius và Maximinus, hai ông bà đã phải đi trốn. Họ tìm thấy một nơi ẩn náu trong rừng gần nhà. Bằng cách nào đó, họ đã thoát khỏi sự bách hại. Họ luôn luôn bị đói khát và lo sợ nhưng không mất đức tin. Họ đã kiên nhẫn chờ đợi và cầu nguyện để chấm dứt sự bách hại. Và cuộc bách hại này đã chấm dứt sau bảy năm dài. Thánh Gregory Nazianzen có ghi lại các chi tiết này. Trong một cuộc bách hại khác, Thánh Macrina và chồng bị mất tất cả tài sản. Họ không còn gì ngoại trừ đức tin và lòng tin tưởng vào sự quan phòng của Thiên Chúa.
