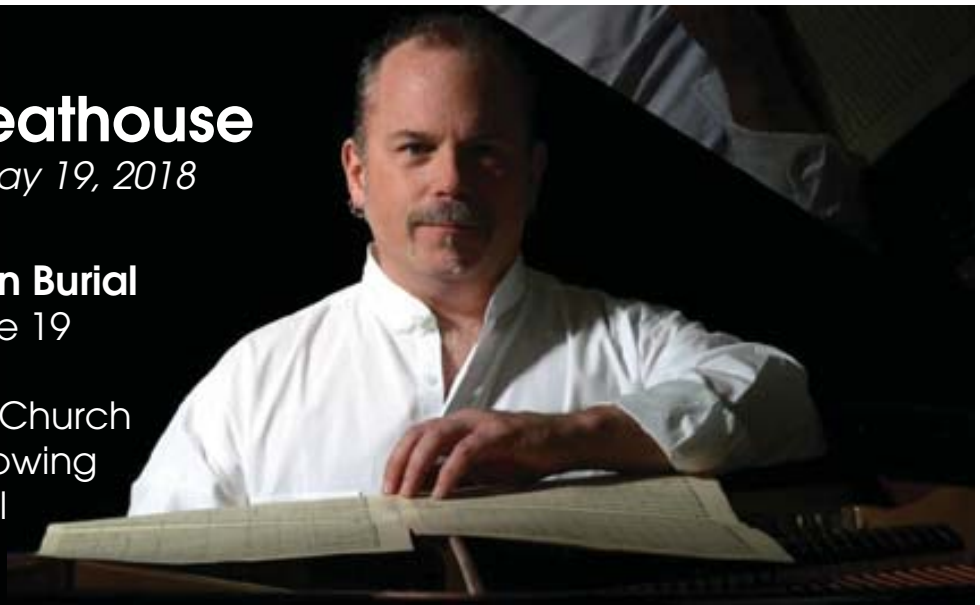

Early Years

John Wingate Greathouse was born on January 6, 1962. He grew up in North Carolina, the youngest of four brothers. Music was God's gift to him from a very early age. His mother was a church organist. He directed his first choir at age 13, hired by a little church that had just lost their music director. He got the job because he could play the organ.

Performing Arts

As a young man Wingate came to California to pursue an education and training in music and the performing arts. He was an alumnus of the Oberlin and San Francisco Conservatories and the USC Scoring for Motion Pictures and TV Graduate program.

He performed roles in such musicals as Sweeney Todd, Company, Candide, and A Little Night Music. His operatic roles include the title role in Rossini's *Le Comte Ory*, Quint in Benjamin Britten's *Turn of the Screw*, and St. Chavez in Virgil Thompson's *Four Saints in Three Acts*.

As a professional singer, he performed as tenor soloist with many San Francisco Bay Area arts organizations, including the San Francisco Symphony Chorus, Masterworks Chorale and San Francisco Choral Society. In recent

years he sang in the Los Angeles Master Chorale and with Pacific Swingline.

He composed music for films and television and also created choral works: *Mass for the Saints (A Mass in Jazz Style)*, *Alpha and Omega*, *Choral Variations on Amazing Grace*, *Antiphonal Mass for Advent & Christmastide*, and *Three Prayers from the Spiritual Exercises of Saint Ignatius*.

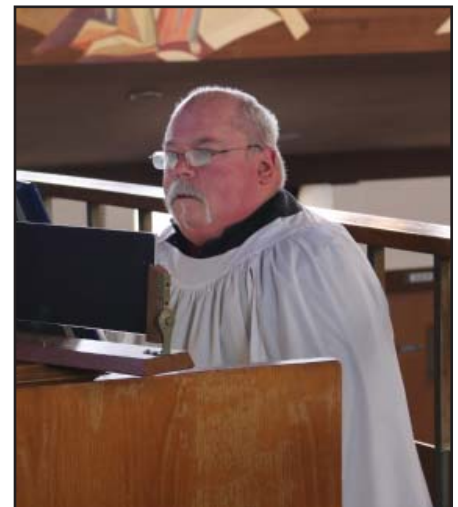

Former pastor Fr. Bruce Patterson hired Wingate as Director of Music Ministry on August 1, 2009.

Preparing music for the liturgy gave Wingate time to spend with the Word of God. He carefully considered what music would reflect the Word and enhance the worship of the community. He was conscientious in his responsibility to ensure that all music was appropriate and liturgically correct.

Wingate was a fine musician and composed music all the time. The Traditional Choir sang his compositions almost weekly. St. Bonaventure now has a huge music library from what he composed.

Wingate was inclusive and very much at home directing tri-lingual events, e.g., the annual Christmas Concert, Thanksgiving Mass and Easter Vigil.



Perhaps his most daunting task was directing the Children's Choir; he had never worked with children before. Wingate loved working with them and was so proud of them. Their choir year would end with pizza, popcorn and a movie.

Considering his success in the performing arts, surprisingly, Wingate was very much an introvert. He could be seen walking purposefully down the aisle to the choir loft or to his office with few pauses along the way. As a person he grew a lot during his time in ministry, considering fellow staff and choir members as his family.

Of Wingate it is said: He never lost his temper with the choir. He was kind. He was endlessly patient. He loved what was cool. He loved music. He loved St. Bonaventure.

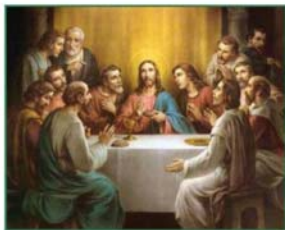

Chúa Nhật II Thường Niên Năm B



Mc 4, 26-34: "Khi ấy, Chúa Giêsu phán cùng dân chúng rằng: "Nước Thiên Chúa giống như người kia đã gieo hạt xuống đất: người đó ngủ hay thức, đêm hay ngày, hạt giống cứ đâm mầm và mọc lên thế nào người đó cũng không hay biết nữa. Đất tự nó làm cây lúa mọc lên: trước hết thành cây, rồi đâm bông, rồi kết hạt. Và khi lúa chín, người ấy liền gặt vì đã đến mùa".

Đấng Đáng Kính Matt Talbot (1856-1925)

Ông Matt có thể coi là quan thầy của những người đang chiến đấu với sự nghiện rượu.

Matt sinh ở Dublin, là nơi cha ông làm việc ở bến tàu và không có thời giờ nhiều cho gia đình. Sau một vài năm đi học, Matt kiếm được công việc giao thư từ cho các nhà buôn rượu; từ đó bắt đầu Matt uống rượu như hũ chìm.

Trong vòng 15 năm -- cho đến khi 30 tuổi -- Matt là người nghiện rượu. Một ngày kia, ông "tự hứa" không uống rượu trong vòng ba tháng, ông đi xưng tội và bắt đầu tham dự Thánh Lễ hàng ngày. Hiển nhiên là những năm đầu tiên sau khi thể hứa thật khó khăn. Chỉ cần tránh gặp các tay bạn nhậu không thôi cũng đã khó. Tuy nhiên, ông đã trông nhờ đến sự trợ giúp của Thiên Chúa. Trước đây ông uống rượu như thế nào thì bây giờ ông cũng cầu nguyện như vậy. Đồng thời ông tìm cách trả lại tiền vay mượn hoặc ăn cắp của người khác trong thời gian nghiện ngập.

Hầu hết cuộc đời của ông là một người lao động nặng nhọc. Ông gia nhập dòng Ba Phanxicô và bắt đầu một đời sống khắc khổ sám hối; ông kiêng thịt đến chín tháng mỗi năm. Hàng đêm, ông dành nhiều thời giờ để đọc sách thiêng liêng cũng như hạnh các thánh. Ông lần chuỗi Mai Khôi một cách có ý thức. Mặc dù đồng lương của ông thật khiêm tốn, ông đã rộng lượng đóng góp cho công cuộc truyền giáo.

Vào năm 1925, sức khỏe ông sa sút đến độ phải nghỉ việc. Và vào ngày lễ Chúa Ba Ngôi, ông đã từ trần trên đường đến nhà thờ. Năm mươi năm sau, Đức Giáo Hoàng Phaolô VI đã ban cho ông tước vị đáng kính.
