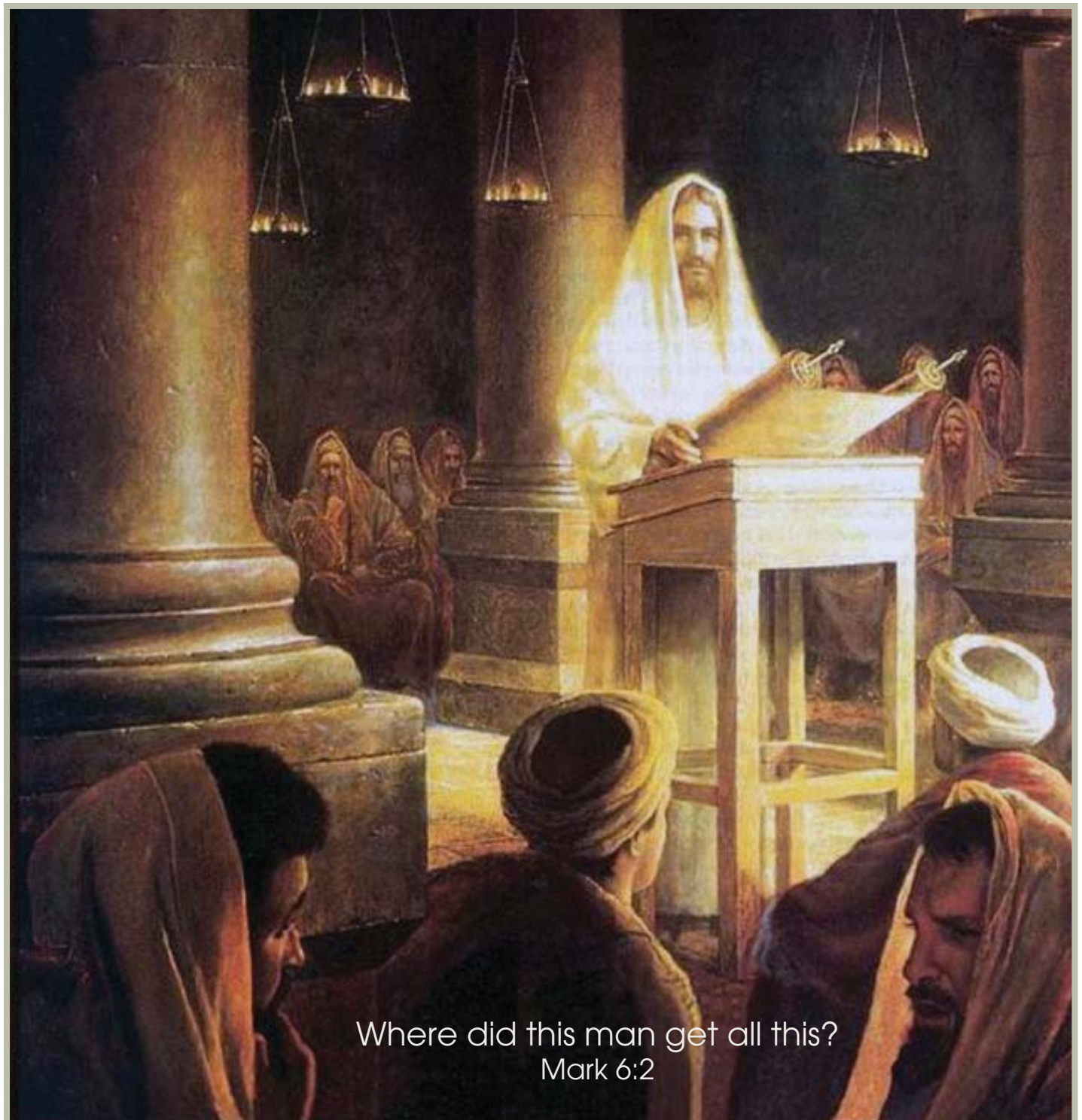

**PASTOR'S CORNER**

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Last week we heard that Jairus, the synagogue leader, put his faith in Jesus and our Lord raised his daughter from the dead. Jesus said, "Do not be afraid, just have faith" (Mark 5:36). The suffering woman put her faith in Jesus, and she was cured of her twelve years of internal hemorrhaging. Jesus said, "Daughter, your faith has saved you. Go in peace and be cured of your affliction" (Mark 5:34).

The Son of God became man and was born of the Blessed Virgin Mary. He traveled through Israel curing the sick, raising from the dead, and preaching the Good News of forgiveness of sins and eternal life with God. Everywhere he went the people praised him, except in the town where he grew up. They remembered him as just another kid of the village. Even as an adult they remembered him as just the carpenter. They could not believe that he was a great prophet, let alone the Son of God. Jesus told them, "A prophet is not without honor except in his native place and among his own kin and in his own house" (Mark 6:4). "Jesus was amazed at their lack of faith" (Mark 6:6).

Lord, when our faith is weak, please strengthen it.

Lord, when our faith isn't even the size of a mustard seed, help it to grow.

Lord, for those who think they've lost their faith, please surprise them with a new gift of faith.

Lord, fill us with a faith beyond our wildest dreams.

Lord, thank you for loving us to death and resurrection.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I have another important topic that I want to address with you, our parishioners. I want to thank those who regularly support our parish through the Sunday collection. I am asking for everyone to please give to our Sunday collection. This is the main way we pay for all the services we provide at St. Bonaventure. This includes the parish priests, office staff and support personnel. This includes the cost of maintaining fifty-year-old buildings as well as paying for utilities.

Some parishioners have asked me what happens when we fall short. They say, "Do you get money from the Bishop?" The answer is no, he doesn't give us any money. Nor should he have to. In fact, 11% of each parish's income helps support the diocesan offices and the Bishop.

In asking you for support, I assure you that we are doing everything we can to be good stewards of the gifts you give us. We are also tightening our belts. We are making the following cost reductions for the new fiscal year: 1) Department heads have reduced total spending by \$73,245 compared with last year's budget; 2) Executive staff are willingly taking a 10% cut in pay; 3) We will also lower costs by reducing office hours. (New hours are listed on back of bulletin.)

Please help us with your prayers. Please help us with your sacrificial giving. Please help us with your involvement in the parish ministries. We're in this together. Together with God's help we will make this work.

In future Pastor's Letters I will be telling you about how Father Martin, Father Tim, and I are prayerful reflecting together on the Scripture Reading to enhance our Sunday Masses including the homilies and music. Our staff is finding creative ways to help all of us grow in our relationship with the Lord. Let's pray and work together to grow closer to one another and the Lord.

## HOPE OFFICE

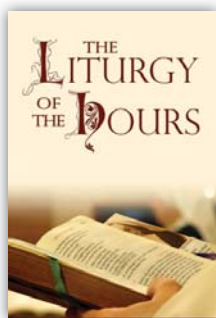

## LITURGY OF THE HOURS

*By tradition going back to early Christian times, the Divine Office is devised so that the whole course of the day and night is made holy by the praises of God. Therefore, when this wonderful song of praise is rightly performed by priests or by the faithful praying together, then it is truly the voice of the bride addressed to her bridegroom; it is the very prayer which Christ himself, together with his body, addresses to the Father. —Sacrosanctum Concilium, no. 84*

The Liturgy of the Hours is not only the prayer of clerics, but the very prayer of all the Church. At St. Bonaventure Church the Liturgy of the Hours (Morning Prayer) is recited weekdays at 6:00 a.m. and Saturday at 7:00 a.m. The Liturgy of the Hours (Evening Prayer) is recited weekdays at 5:00 p.m. Come join us as we give praise to the Lord and pray for the salvation of the whole world. If you're not able to attend, there are many digital apps and web sites that make praying the Divine Office available in a variety of formats. Praise God!

## DIFFERENT ELEMENTS OF THE MASS

45. SACRED SILENCE, as part of the celebration, is to be observed at designated times. Its nature, however, depends on the moment when it occurs in the different parts of the celebration.

For in the Penitential Act and again after the Opening Prayer, individuals recollect themselves; whereas after a Reading or after the Homily, all meditate briefly on what they have heard; and then again after Communion, they praise God in their hearts and pray to him.

Even before the celebration of Mass itself, it is a praiseworthy practice for silence to be observed in the church, in the sacristy, in the vesting room, and in adjacent areas, so that all may dispose themselves to carry out the sacred celebration in a devout and fitting manner.

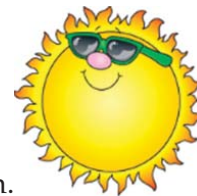

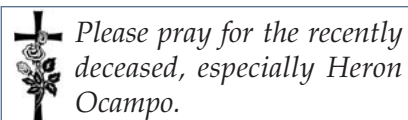

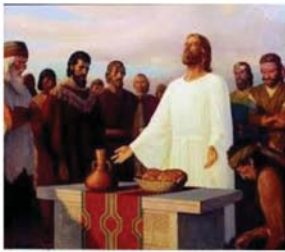

## VIETNAMESE COMMUNITY'S PAGE

## Chúa Nhật 14 Thường Niên Năm B



*Mc 6, 1-6: "Không một tiên tri nào mà không bị khinh bỉ ở quê hương, gia đình họ hàng mình". Ở đó Người không làm phép lạ nào được, ngoại trừ đặt tay chữa vài bệnh nhân, và Người ngạc nhiên vì họ cứng lòng tin. Người đi rảo qua các làng chung quanh mà giảng dạy".*

**Chân Phước Gregory Grassi và Các Bạn (k. 1900)**

Các nhà thừa sai Kitô Giáo thường bị bắt trong các cuộc chiến chống với chính quốc gia của mình. Khi các chính phủ Anh, Đức, Nga và Pháp buộc nhà cầm quyền Trung Hoa phải nhượng bộ đất đai vào năm 1898, cả một phong trào chống người ngoại quốc nổi dậy ở Trung Hoa.

Gregory Grassi sinh ở Ý năm 1833, thụ phong linh mục năm 1856 và năm năm sau ngài được sai đến Trung Hoa Lục Địa. Sau đó Cha Gregory được tấn phong làm Giám Mục của giáo phận Bắc Shanxi. Vào năm 1900, trong cuộc nổi dậy của các võ sĩ, cùng với 14 nhà truyền giáo Âu Châu và 14 tu sĩ Trung Hoa, ngài chịu tử đạo vào thời kỳ bách hại ngắn ngủi nhưng đẫm máu ấy.

Hai mươi sáu vị tử đạo bị bắt theo lệnh của Yu Hsien, quan đầu tỉnh Shanxi. Tất cả bị chết chém vào ngày 9 tháng Bảy 1900. Năm vị thuộc dòng Phanxicô Hèn Mọn; bảy vị thuộc tu hội Phanxicô Truyền Giáo của Đức Maria -- là các vị tử đạo tiên khởi của tu hội.

Về phía người Trung Hoa có bảy chủng sinh và bốn giáo dân, tất cả đều thuộc dòng Ba Phanxicô. Ba giáo dân Trung Hoa khác bị giết ở Shanxi chỉ vì làm việc cho các tu sĩ Phanxicô và bị bắt cùng với các người khác. Ba tu sĩ Phanxicô người Ý cũng được tử đạo trong tuần đó ở tỉnh Hunan.

Tất cả các vị tử đạo được phong chân phước vào năm 1946.
