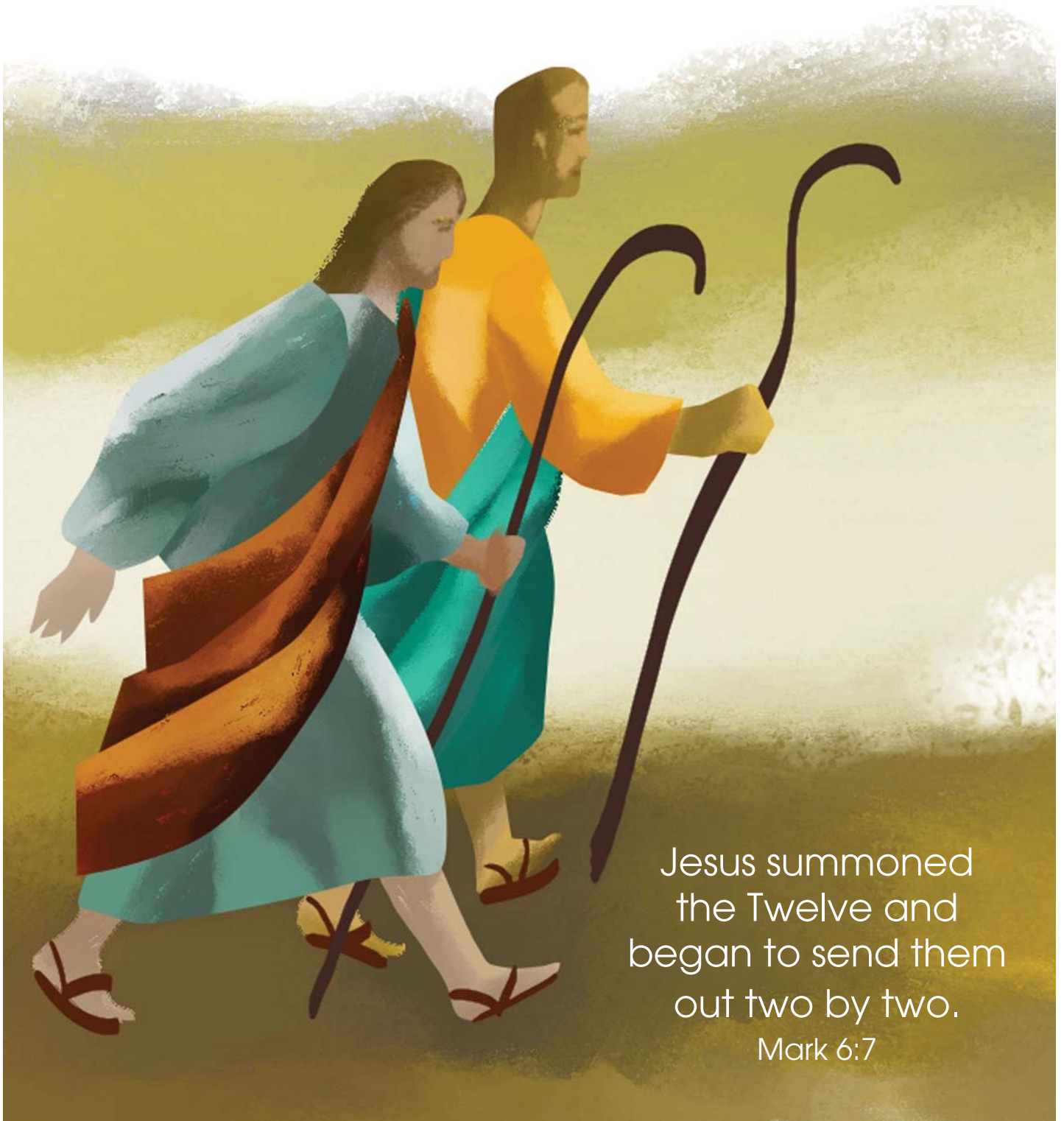

## PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Amos was content with being a shepherd as well as a tree trimmer (dresser of sycamores). However, we find out in this Sunday's First Reading that God had other plans for him: "The Lord took me from my flock, and said to me, 'Go, prophesy to my people Israel.'" (Amos 7:15)

Prior to meeting Jesus, the Apostles were content to being fishermen and tax collectors. However, God had other plans for them. Not only do they leave everything and follow Jesus, the Son of God, but then he sends them out to do what he has been doing. In the Gospel this Sunday (Mark 6:7-13), Jesus sends the Twelve Apostles out two by two. He gives them authority over unclean spirits. They are to journey with nothing extra. They cannot bring food, sack, money, or a second tunic. Other than a walking stick, they are limited to the clothes and sandals they are wearing. Their message is straight forward: Repent! Their mission is to drive out demons and anoint the sick with oil and cure them.

July 15 is the Feast Day of our parish patron St. Bonaventure. He was born in the year 1221. God's plan for St. Bonaventure led him to enter the Order of Friars Minor (Franciscans) in 1238. He studied and then taught at the University of Paris. St. Bonaventure was one of the most learned men of his time, yet he said that a fool's love and knowledge of God may be greater than that of a humanly wise man.

Both St. Bonaventure and St. Thomas Aquinas received their degrees of Doctor on October 23, 1257. Earlier that year, St. Bonaventure was elected Minister General of the Franciscans. He proved himself to be a great leader who helped unify the Franciscans. He also wrote the definitive biography of St. Francis of Assisi. He was made a Cardinal by the Pope in 1273. The legates tried to give St. Bonaventure his Cardinal's hat, but he told them to hang it on a nearby tree since he was washing dishes and his hands were wet and greasy. He died in 1274 while helping Pope Gregory X with the Ecumenical Council at Lyons. Of note is that St. Thomas Aquinas died that same year while on his way to the Council.

More could be said of this great saint; however, suffice it to say, he truly followed the plan that God had called him to. St. Bonaventure followed God's plan with "tender piety and profound learning." (*Catholic Encyclopedia, St. Bonaventure*)

Through the intercession of the Twelve Apostles and St. Bonaventure may we come to know what God's plan is for us. Today's Alleluia Verse prays it well, "May the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ enlighten the eyes of our hearts, that we may know what is the hope that belongs to our call." (Ephesians 1:17-18)

From "Journey of the Mind to God" by Saint Bonaventure

**C**HRISt is both the way and the door. Christ is the staircase and the vehicle, like the throne of mercy over the Ark of the Covenant, and the mystery hidden from the ages. A man should turn his full attention to this throne of mercy, and should gaze at him hanging on the cross, full of faith, hope and charity, devoted, full of wonder and joy, marked by gratitude, and open to praise and jubilation. Then such a man will make with Christ a pasch, that is, a passing-over. ... He will experience, as much as is possible for one who is still living, what was promised to the thief who hung beside Christ: Today you will be with me in paradise. ... If you ask how such things can occur, seek the answer in God's grace, not in doctrine; in the longing of the will, not in the understanding; in the sighs of prayer, not in research; seek the bridegroom not the teacher; God and not man; darkness not daylight; and look not to the light but rather to the raging fire that carries the soul to God with intense fervor and glowing love. The fire is God, and the furnace is in Jerusalem, fired by Christ in the ardor of his loving passion.

### The Need For Blood

Every two seconds someone in the United States needs blood. Yet blood cannot be manufactured; it must be given by volunteer donors. Because blood has a limited shelf life, the community blood supply must constantly be replenished to meet patients' needs. You can make a life-saving contribution by donating your blood.

### Giving Blood is Simple

- **Before you give:** Get a good night's sleep. Have a good breakfast or lunch. Drink extra water and fluids (avoiding caffeinated beverages). Eat iron-rich food like fortified cereals and broccoli and avoid fatty foods like hamburgers, fries or ice cream.
- **While you give:** Wear clothing with sleeves that can be raised above the elbow. Show the staff your "good vein" that may have been used to draw blood in the past. Be sure to relax.
- **After you give:** Enjoy a snack and drink in the refreshment canteen. Drink plenty of fluids in the next 24 to 48 hours. Avoid strenuous physical activity or heavy lifting for about five hours and eat a well-balanced meal.
- **Remember:** Be sure to bring your ID: Driver's License, Student ID, State ID, etc. Donors seldom experience discomfort after giving, but if you feel light-headed, lie down until the feeling goes away. If bleeding occurs after you take off the bandage, apply pressure to the site and raise your arm until the bleeding stops. If bruising or bleeding appears under the skin, apply a cold pack.

## **DECREE**

### **PROCLAIMING A HOLY YEAR OF PREPARATION OF CHRIST CATHEDRAL**

#### **“A place for Christ forever... The dedication of Christ Cathedral”**

I, Bishop Kevin William Vann, fourth Bishop of Orange in California, by the grace of God and the Apostolic See:

Whereas, after years of planning, prayer and Faith, and due to the hard work, diligence and dedication of many, we find ourselves, by the Providence of God, rapidly approaching the completion of the renovation of Christ Cathedral (formerly called the “Crystal Cathedral”);

Whereas, with profound gratitude to God -- as the one who “builds His House” -- to the planners and workers who continue to labor that the building project is on schedule, I have set the date when I will dedicate Christ Cathedral as 17 July 2019;

Whereas, I recognize the essential involvement of many people of good will in the Diocese of Orange to make this campus a center for evangelization so that as many people as possible may be helped to know, love and praise God in this life so that we might spend eternity with him in the next;

Whereas, no one should be denied an opportunity to participate in this historic endeavor in a tangible way;

Whereas, I desire that all people of good will enter into a spirit of prayer 1) to continue to pray for the workers who do not cease to give of themselves in order to bring this project to completion; 2) for others involved in the completion of the Cathedral renovation, that they may make informed and wise choices; 3) that the project may stay within budget; 4) that more generous benefactors present themselves; and 5) that this entire campus may be welcoming, bringing the visitor to an encounter with Christ or at least planting the seeds for an eventual encounter with the Risen Lord;

Whereas, I would be most pleased if the faithful were on fire for Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and that his Holy Name be always on our lips as we prepare this place for Christ forever;

Whereas, I exhort the faithful to avail themselves of the many opportunities made available at various parishes in the Diocese of Orange to spend time in Eucharistic adoration, keeping in mind that Our Lord Jesus Christ is eager to hear from his sons and daughters and that praying before the Blessed Sacrament in the monstrance or in the tabernacle fosters closeness with Jesus Christ;

Whereas, I invite the faithful to pray to our Blessed Mother Mary, Our Lady of Guadalupe, our Diocesan Patroness, that she might drape her mantle around her sons and daughters in Christ, just as she comforted Saint Juan Diego.

Whereas, I ask the faithful not to overlook or undervalue the pious, but nowadays set aside and often forgotten practice, of the offering up of one's sufferings for the souls in purgatory or for grown children who, for whatever reason(s), no longer practice the true faith nor avail themselves regularly of the sacrament of reconciliation so as to help prepare their hearts most fully for the spiritual blessings of the new Cathedral;

Whereas, the undertaking of pious works, including attending Holy Mass on weekdays as well as the offering up of their prayers, sacrifices and sufferings for the success of the Cathedral's evangelization efforts are most efficacious;

Whereas, one may qualify to gain a plenary indulgence who visits the Blessed Sacrament for adoration and spends at least thirty minutes in adoration or who prays the rosary devoutly in a church or oratory or in a family or who reads or listens to sacred scripture with due reverence to the divine word for at least thirty minutes as well as those who exercise of the Way of the Cross<sup>i</sup>

## DECREE

That, in accord with canons 35 and 48 of the *Code of Canon Law*, a Holy Year of Preparation for the Opening of Christ Cathedral is to begin today, the Solemnity of the Apostles Saints Peter and Paul and will continue through the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus on 28 June 2019.

Given in Garden Grove, from the halls of the Pastoral Center on this 29<sup>th</sup> day of June in the year of Our Lord 2018, the liturgical solemnity of the Princes of the Apostles, Saints Peter and Paul and the sixth year of my episcopacy of the Diocese of Orange in California.

<sup>i</sup> According to the *Enchiridion Indulgentiarum* ("Manual of Indulgences, Fourth Edition"), for one to gain a plenary indulgence, he or she must be baptized and in the state of grace and have "the interior disposition of complete detachment from sin, even venial sin" (otherwise the person could gain a partial indulgence only). Moreover, the person must sacramentally confess his/her sins within twenty days of performing the pious work (before or after); receive Holy Communion and pray for the intentions of the Holy Father. One must have the intention (or at least general intention) to gain the indulgence.

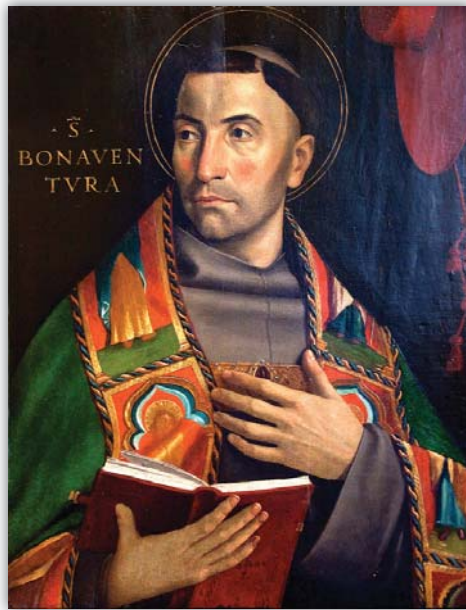

## PAGINA DE LA COMUNIDAD HISPANA

### Nuestro Santo Patrón **SAN BUENAVENTURA** Domingo 15 de Julio

Su verdadero nombre es Juan de Fidanza, que era el de su padre. Nació en Bagnorea, cerca de Viterbo, en Toscana. Se dice que el sobrenombre de Buenaventura, con el cual es universalmente conocido, se le dio a consecuencia de una curación milagrosa lograda, durante su infancia, o por el taumaturgo San Francisco de Asís en persona, o por su propia madre Ritella, que quiso expresar así su gratitud por el "feliz acontecimiento" (buona ventura).



La Orden de San Francisco estaba entonces en plena florecencia. En el Convento de los Frailes Menores de su pueblo natal fue donde el niño hizo sus primeros estudios. Pero a la edad de 17 años, en 1236, ya estaba él en París y rápidamente conquistaba el título de "maestro en artes."

Obtuvo el grado de Bachiller bíblico en 1248. Comienza a "leer la Sagrada Escritura", luego a comentar las Sentencias de Pedro Lombardo. Viene a ser entonces colega de Santo Tomás y contrae con él una conmovedora amistad que a despecho de ciertas divergencias de método no se debilitan jamás.

La sabiduría de su administración y el prestigio de su talento y de su virtud le valieron que sus contemporáneos le otorgaran el título de "segundo fundador" de la Orden franciscana.

Tomás de Aquino canonizó muy gentilmente a su amigo: "Dejemos dijo que un santo escriba la vida de otro santo." En 1273 el Papa Gregorio X le ordenó formalmente aceptar la doble dignidad de Cardenal y de obispo de Albano. Muere a la edad de cincuenta y tres años el 14 de julio de 1274.
