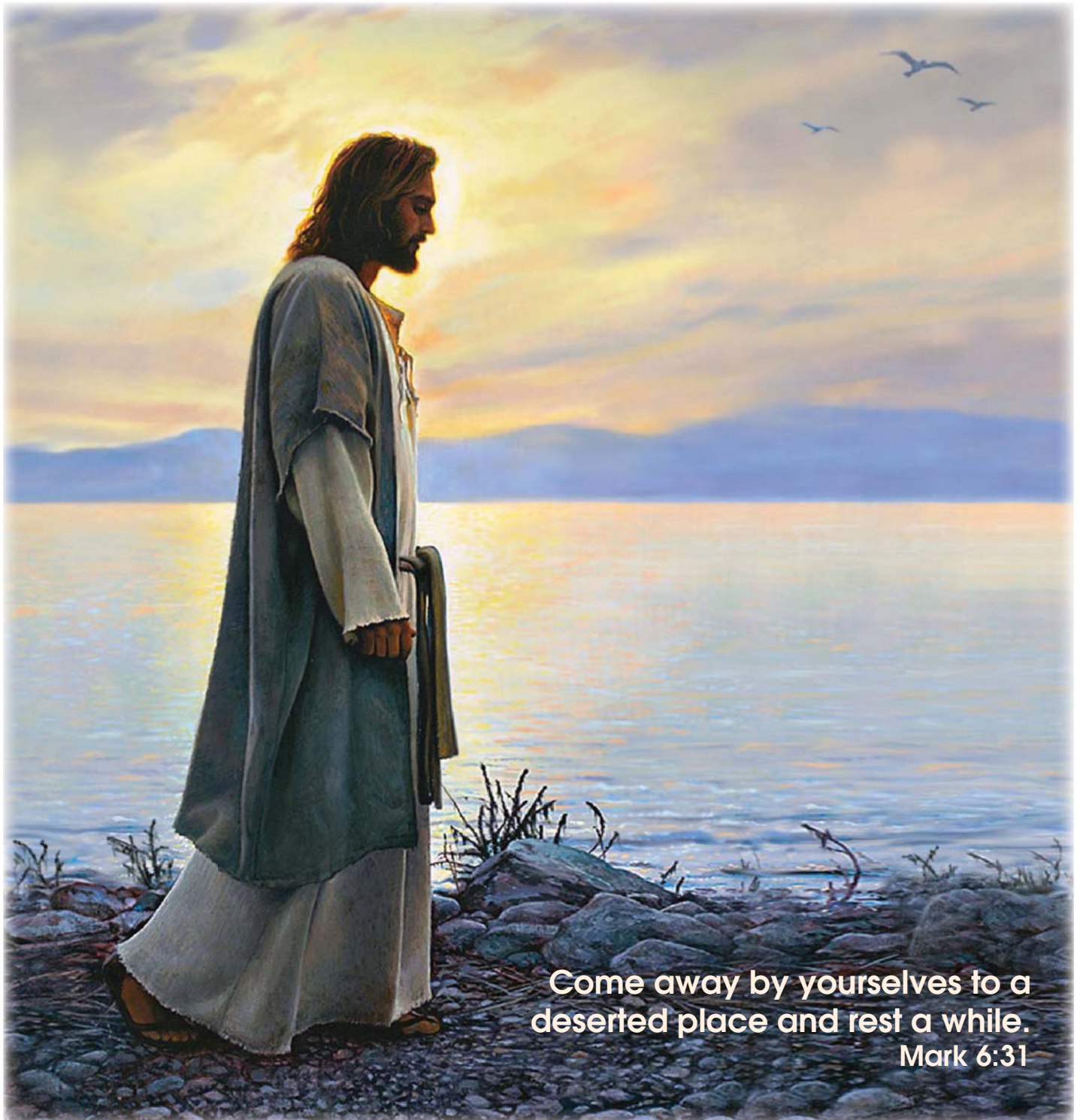

PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Shepherding is a special type of leadership. It doesn't fit into the corporate model of power and control. It's different from being a manager. Shepherding is the leadership approach of Jesus Christ. Shepherding is how he wanted his apostles to lead. Shepherding requires spending time with those you are leading. And doing this not from above, but in the midst of the people. It requires a clear message. Last week Jesus sent forth the Twelve two by two. They had to work as a team. Jesus told them to preach repentance, drive out demons, and anoint and cure the sick.

Another word for shepherd is pastor. As pastor, I need to walk in the midst of the community. Along with Father Tim, Father Martin and our deacons, we are called to preach repentance, to free people from sin through the Sacrament of Penance, to anoint and cure the sick through the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. We are called to feed the community through the Word of God and the Sacrament of the Body and Blood of Christ. As Jesus needed the Twelve to assist him, so we, the priests of St. Bonaventure need your help to proclaim the Gospel of our Lord. Our parish mission statement expresses it well. Our mission is to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ through word, sacrament, service, and community life. To do this effectively, we must spend time with our Lord.

In this Sunday's Gospel (Mark 6:30-34) Jesus told the Twelve to "Come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while." I thank you for letting us get away at the beginning of June for our Priest Retreat. It was a great opportunity to be with Jesus and rest awhile. Our retreat-master described a retreat as a vacation with Jesus. A retreat is a time to rest with the Lord. But this is not just for priests. When Deacon Joe Sullivan, Father Tim, Father Martin and myself reflected on this Sunday's Gospel, we realized we can all benefit from getting away and resting with the Lord. It is vital to find time and a place in your home to rest with the Lord.

For those who came to the family event with Father Tim last week, I hope this was a wonderful time of resting with the Lord. We'll continue to offer ideas and ways on how to rest with the Lord. Please pray for me and all our priests and deacons. We need your prayers to be good shepherds and walk in the footsteps of the Good Shepherd, Jesus Christ.

Every two seconds someone in the United States needs blood. Yet blood cannot be manufactured; it must be given by volunteer donors. Because blood has a limited shelf life, the community blood supply must constantly be replenished to meet patients' needs. You can make a life-saving contribution by donating your blood.

Giving Blood is Simple

- **Before you give:** Get a good night's sleep. Have a good breakfast or lunch. Drink extra water and fluids (avoiding caffeinated beverages). Eat iron-rich food like fortified cereals and broccoli and avoid fatty foods like hamburgers, fries or ice cream.
- **While you give:** Wear clothing with sleeves that can be raised above the elbow. Show the staff your "good vein" that may have been used to draw blood in the past. Be sure to relax.
- **After you give:** Enjoy a snack and drink in the refreshment canteen. Drink plenty of fluids in the next 24 to 48 hours. Avoid strenuous physical activity or heavy lifting for about five hours and eat a well-balanced meal.
- **Remember:** Be sure to bring your ID: Driver's License, Student ID, State ID, etc. Donors seldom experience discomfort after giving, but if you feel light-headed, lie down until the feeling goes away. If bleeding occurs after you take off the bandage, apply pressure to the site and raise your arm until the bleeding stops. If bruising or bleeding appears under the skin, apply a cold pack.

Colette's Children's Home BACK-TO-SCHOOL DRIVE FOR HOMELESS KIDS August 11-12

On the weekend of August 11-12, St. Bonaventure Justice + Peace Ministry is hosting a back-to-school drive for the children at Colette's Children's Home (CCH). CCH operates several local shelters serving women and children who have fallen into homelessness due to crises such as job loss or domestic violence. Last year, CCH received 4,733 requests for housing and supportive services. Of those requests, CCH was able to provide housing and supportive services to 633 homeless women and children in Orange County.

Many of these children will be going to school next month. Sadly, they don't have the clothes and supplies they need to begin the new school year. The children range in age from kindergarten to high school.

Justice + Peace Ministry would like to send them back to school with the clothes and supplies needed to do well. We ask our parish community to join in this effort.

Will you be doing back-to-school shopping? Please consider buying for one more child, perhaps the age of your child. Ask your child what they would want to have in their backpack for school, or a piece of clothing they would like, and purchase one more for a homeless child.



Then, bring these new backpacks, school supplies, and clothing items to church the weekend of August 11-12 or to the parish center before then. We can also use gift cards to Payless for shoes and Kohl's or Walmart for basic clothing. Justice + Peace Ministry will deliver your donation to CCH and bless these little ones. Participants will observe and learn about the local wetlands, its diverse inhabitants and their importance. Expect to see birds, reptiles and the nesting site of an endangered species.



Steven, Justice + Peace member and Bolsa Chica volunteer, will lead the group and provide insights into the many marvels you will encounter. Topics may include: wetland ecology, animals and plants, endangered species, wetland importance and benefits, and wetland issues.

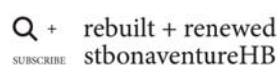
