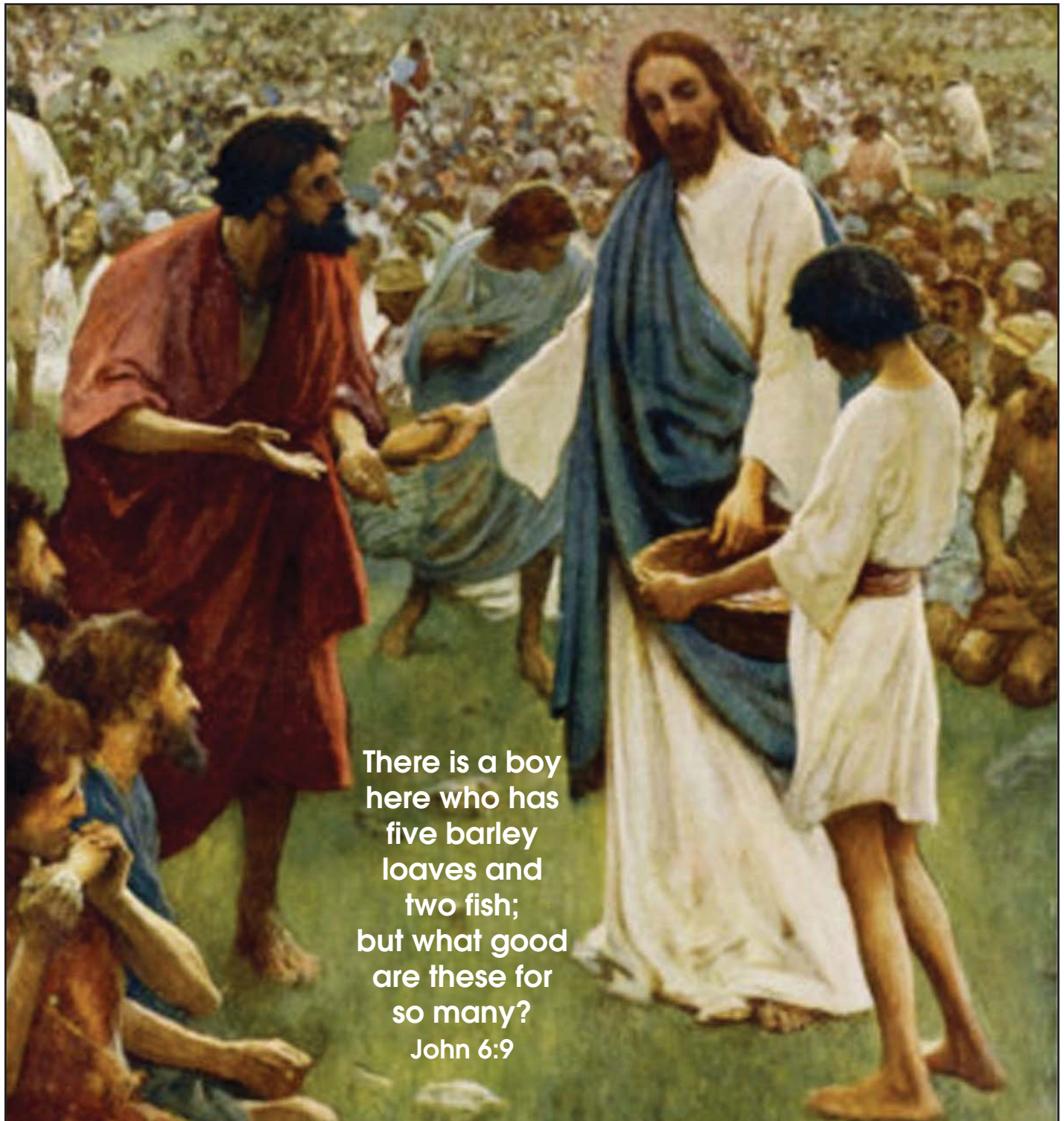

PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

During Ordinary Time of this Liturgical Year, Cycle B, the Scripture passages come from the Gospel according to Mark. However, since this is the shortest Gospel, there aren't enough passages to cover 34 Sundays of Ordinary Time. The Church therefore inserts chapter six of the Gospel according to John in the middle of this Liturgical Year. This chapter is appropriately called the Bread of Life chapter. We will be reflecting on this chapter for the next five Sundays. These are the 17th through the 21st Sundays in Ordinary Time. This will give the priests and deacons of St. Bonaventure an opportunity to reflect on how different parts of the Mass tie in with different passages of this Gospel. This is a great opportunity to encounter Jesus Christ through the Holy Scriptures and the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

We are really looking forward to these Bread of Life Sundays.

MISSION CO-OP APPEAL

August 4-5

Bishop Joseph Kopacz of the Diocese of Jackson, Mississippi will be with us next weekend to appeal for help for the Diocese of Jackson, the largest diocese east of the Mississippi River with a Catholic population of around 50,000. The Diocese of Jackson has nine counties without a resident priest. Recently there was an appeal to hire a religious sister for one of these priestless counties. Unfortunately, there was not enough money and the county remains without a Catholic religious presence of any kind. Bishop Kopacz will be speaking at all the Masses next weekend, except the Vietnamese and Sunday 5:00 p.m. Masses.

APPEAL 2018

To date we have received pledges of \$186,818 which is above our \$162,000 "fair share." Any payments on pledges over \$162,000 will come back to our parish as a rebate. Thank you to all who have already participated. However, only 335 families have pledged. We need many more to participate. More pledges will mean a greater rebate for our parish. THE OFFERTORY

At the heart of the Eucharistic celebration are the bread and wine that, by the words of Christ and the invocation of the Holy Spirit, become Christ's Body and Blood.

In the Offertory we give thanks to the Creator for bread and wine, fruit of the "work of human hands," but above all as "fruit of the earth" and "of the vine" — gifts of the Creator.



The Church sees in the gesture of the king-priest Melchizedek, who "brought out bread and wine," a prefiguring of her own offering. In the Old Covenant bread and wine were offered in sacrifice among the first fruits of the earth as a sign of grateful acknowledgment to the Creator.

But they also received a new significance in the context of the Exodus: the unleavened bread that Israel eats every year at Passover commemorates the haste of the departure that liberated them from Egypt; the remembrance of the manna in the desert will always recall to Israel that it lives by the bread of the Word of God; their daily bread is the fruit of the promised land, the pledge of God's faithfulness to his promises.

The "cup of blessing" at the end of the Jewish Passover meal adds to the festive joy of wine an eschatological dimension: the messianic expectation of the rebuilding of Jerusalem.

When Jesus instituted the Eucharist, he gave a new and definitive meaning to the blessing of the bread and the cup. The miracles of the multiplication of the loaves, when the Lord says the blessing, breaks and distributes the loaves through his disciples to feed the multitude, prefigure the superabundance of this unique bread of his Eucharist.

The sign of water turned into wine at Cana already announces the Hour of Jesus' glorification. It makes manifest the fulfillment of the wedding feast in the Father's kingdom, where the faithful will drink the new wine that has become the Blood of Christ.

From the very beginning Christians have brought, along with the bread and wine for the Eucharist, gifts to share with those in need. This custom of the collection, ever appropriate, is inspired by the example of Christ who became poor to make us rich. We offer our time, talent, and treasure, but we also offer our hopes, joys, dreams, struggles, suffering, losses; our everything. Whatever we can offer is received by the Lord, blessed, broken, transformed and offered back to us in a superabundant way, providing for our every need.

Colette's Children's Home
BACK-TO-SCHOOL DRIVE FOR HOMELESS KIDS
 August 11-12

On the weekend of August 11-12, St. Bonaventure Justice + Peace Ministry is hosting a back-to-school drive for the children at Colette's Children's Home (CCH). CCH operates several local shelters serving women and children who have fallen into homelessness due to crises such as job loss or domestic violence. Last year, CCH received 4,733 requests for housing and supportive services. Of those requests, CCH was able to provide housing and supportive services to 633 homeless women and children in Orange County.

Many of these children will be going to school next month. Sadly, they don't have the clothes and supplies they need to begin the new school year. The children range in age from kindergarten to high school.

Justice + Peace Ministry would like to send them back to school with the clothes and supplies needed to do well. We ask our parish community to join in this effort.

Will you be doing back-to-school shopping? Please consider buying for one more child, perhaps the age of your child. Ask your child what they would want to have in their backpack for school, or a piece of clothing they would like, and purchase one more for a homeless child.



Then, bring these new backpacks, school supplies, and clothing items to church the weekend of August 11-12 or to the parish center before then. We can also use gift cards to Payless for shoes and Kohl's or Walmart for basic clothing. Justice + Peace Ministry will deliver your donation to CCH and bless these little ones. Cada semana somos testigos de un milagro en la Misa. No vemos la multiplicación de panes. Lo que vemos con los ojos de la fe es el milagro de la transformación de elementos comunes, pan y vino, en el Cuerpo y la Sangre del Señor. Una vez que hemos recibido al Señor, comienza la multiplicación, porque en la Eucaristía se nos fortalece para multiplicar nuestros esfuerzos por alimentar a los pobres, darles refugio a los que no tienen hogar y brindarles consuelo a los afligidos.

Suy niệm: Một thực tế là sự phát triển của khoa học kỹ thuật đã cung ứng dư thừa những nhu cầu tiêu dùng của con người. Và một thực tế khác nữa là giữa xã hội no đủ này lại có vô số con người đang phải sống dưới cả mức nghèo đói, không biết ngày mai sẽ ăn gì.
