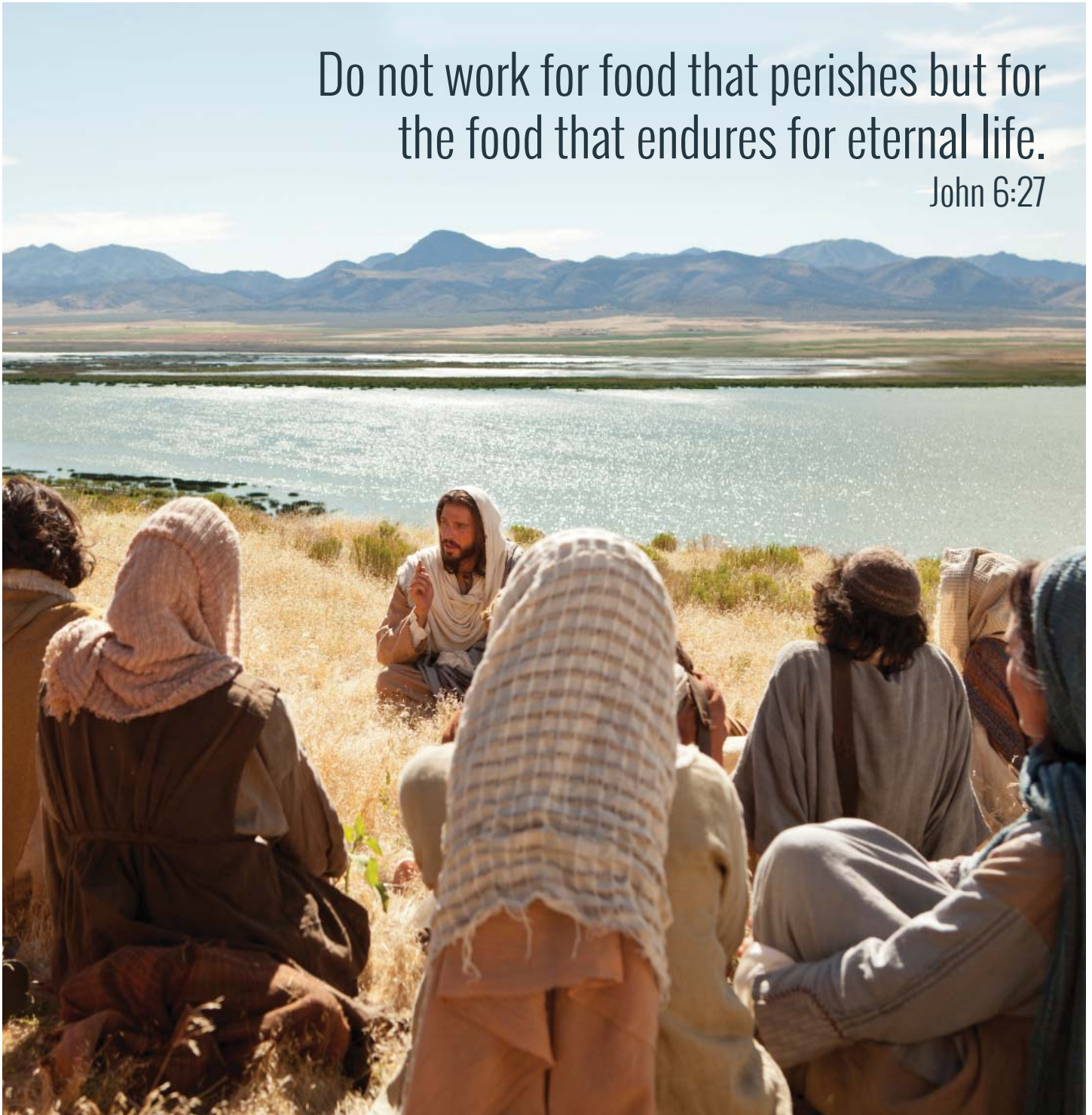

PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We continue with our journey through chapter six of the Gospel according to John. In this Sunday's Gospel passage (John 6:24-35), Jesus wants the crowd to work "for the food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you" (John 6:27). Jesus tells them that God the Father will give them the true bread from heaven. He tells them that he is "the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst" (John 6:35).

Jesus Christ, the Son of God who became Man, is the greatest gift that God the Father has given us. God the Father feeds us with his Son who is the Word of God. God the Father feeds us with Body and Blood of his Son. Every time we participate in Mass we have the opportunity to be fed with Jesus Christ, the Bread of life. Rejoice in this great gift. Thank the Lord, for his great love is without end.

Along with the prayers and blessings the priest offers at Mass, you also offer prayers and blessings. For example, during the Preparation of the Gifts, after the priest has blessed the gifts of bread and wine, he says to the assembly, "Pray, brothers and sisters, that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father." You respond with a blessing prayer, "May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of his name, for our good and the good of all his holy Church." Thank you for your prayerful participation in the Mass.

Jesus said, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, whoever believes in me will never thirst" (John 6:35).

May we always show reverence to the Real Presence of the Son of God in the Most Holy Eucharist.

THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

The center and summit of the entire celebration of the Mass begins with the Eucharistic Prayer. The meaning of the Prayer is that the entire congregation of the faithful should join itself with Christ in confessing the great deeds of God and in the offering of Sacrifice. The chief elements making up the Eucharistic Prayer may be distinguished in this way:



- ✦ **Thanksgiving** expressed especially in the Preface;
- ✦ **Acclamation** in which the whole congregation, joining with the heavenly powers, sings the Sanctus;
- ✦ **Epiclesis** in which the Church implores the power of the Holy Spirit that the gifts offered by human hands be consecrated and become Christ's Body and Blood;
- ✦ **Institution narrative and consecration** in which by means of the words and actions of Christ, the Sacrifice is carried out;
- ✦ **Anamnesis** in which the Church keeps the memorial of Christ, recalling especially his blessed Passion, glorious Resurrection, and Ascension into heaven;
- ✦ **Offering** by which the Church, and in particular, the Church here and now gathered offers in the Holy Spirit the spotless Victim to the Father;
- ✦ **Intercessions** by which expression is given to the fact that the Eucharist is celebrated in communion with and offered for the entire Church, of heaven as well as of earth;
- ✦ **Final doxology** by which the glorification of God is expressed and which is confirmed by the people's acclamation, Amen.

In the most blessed sacrament of the Eucharist, the body and blood, together with the soul and divinity, of our Lord Jesus Christ and, therefore, the whole Christ is truly, really, and substantially contained. It is by the conversion (transubstantiation) of the bread and wine into Christ's body and blood that Christ becomes present in this sacrament.

The Church Fathers strongly affirmed the faith of the Church in the efficacy of the Word of Christ and of the action of the Holy Spirit to bring about this conversion. St. John Chrysostom declares: "It is not man that causes the things offered to become the Body and Blood of Christ, but he who was crucified for us, Christ himself. The priest, in the role of Christ, pronounces these words, but their power and grace are God's. This is my body, he says. This word transforms the things offered."

The Eucharistic presence of Christ begins at the moment of the consecration and endures as long as the Eucharistic species (the appearance of bread and wine) subsist. Christ is present whole and entire in each of the species and whole and entire in each of their parts, in such a way that the breaking of the bread does not divide Christ.

Colette's Children's Home

Back-to-School Drive for Homeless Kids



Next weekend August 11-12 St. Bonaventure Justice + Peace Ministry is hosting a back-to-school drive for the children at Colette's Children's Home (CCH). CCH operates several local shelters serving women and children who have fallen into homelessness due to crises such as job loss or domestic violence. Last year, CCH received 4,733 requests for housing and supportive services. Of those requests, CCH was able to provide housing and supportive services to 633 homeless women and children in Orange County.

Many of these children will be going to school next month. Sadly, they don't have the clothes and supplies they need to begin the new school year. The children range in age from kindergarten to high school.

Justice + Peace Ministry would like to send them back to school with the clothes and supplies needed to do well. We ask our parish community to join in this effort.

Will you be doing back-to-school shopping? Please consider buying for one more child, perhaps the age of your child. Ask your child what they would want to have in their backpack for school, or a piece of clothing they would like, and purchase one more for a homeless child.



Then, bring these new backpacks, school supplies, and clothing items to church the weekend of August 11-12 or to the parish center before then. We can also use gift cards to Payless for shoes and Kohl's or Walmart for basic clothing. Justice + Peace Ministry will deliver your donation to CCH and bless these little ones. PASTORAL SERVICES APPEAL 2018

To date we have received pledges of \$191,129 which is above our \$162,000 "fair share." Any payments on pledges over \$162,000 will come back to our parish as a rebate.

CHURCH RENOVATION UPDATE

GREAT NEWS! We finally have some movement in the several issues with the structural design. The Diocese has assigned a new project manager who is completely dedicated to our project. He has helped break open the roadblocks we've been facing and has encouraged all the parties to work together and solve issues. Bid documents have been mailed to the interested Diocesan-approved contractors and we had our initial job site walk-through on July 30. The contractors have been given until August 24 to respond with a bid. After a contractor is selected, we should get from them our official start date. Chúa Nhật 18 Mùa T.N Năm B **PHÚC ÂM:** Ga 6: 24-35

Suy niệm: Một thực tế là sự phát triển của khoa học kỹ thuật đã cung ứng dư thừa những nhu cầu tiêu dùng của con người. Và một thực tế khác nữa là giữa xã hội no đủ này lại có vô số con người đang phải sống dưới cả mức nghèo đói, không biết ngày mai sẽ ăn gì. Chúng ta thường nghĩ rằng sự nghèo đói cứ tiếp diễn là do hoàn cảnh này, lý do kia, mà ít khi nghĩ rằng vì chúng ta không đủ quảng đại.
