## PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We continue our journey through the sixth chapter of the Gospel according to John. This Sunday the people question how Jesus can come down from heaven since as far as they're concerned he came from human parents, "Is he not Jesus, the son of Joseph? Do we not know his father and mother?" (John 6:42) Yes, Jesus is the Son of Mary, however, his father is not Joseph, but God the Father. Jesus is the One sent from the Father who promises and gives eternal life to those who believe in Jesus as the Son of God.

Jesus is "the true bread from heaven." (John 6:32) Jesus is "the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, whoever believes in me will never thirst." (John 6:35) Jesus wants to feed them with the living bread, "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." (John 6:51)

This is what we are doing here at Mass. We listen to Jesus in the Scripture readings from the Old and New Testament. This is in the Liturgy of the Word: the First Reading, Responsorial Psalm, the Second Reading, and the Gospel. We are nourished by Jesus through the bread and wine that become his Body and Blood during the Liturgy of the Eucharist: "Take this, all of you, and eat of it, for this is my Body, which will be given up for you. Take this, all of you, and drink from it, for this is the chalice of my Blood, the Blood of the new and eternal covenant, which will be poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this in memory of me." (Luke 22:14-20; Matthew 26:26-30; Mark 14:22-26)

This Sunday during this Mass you will encounter Jesus, the Son of God sent from the Father to feed us with his Flesh and Blood. Put your complete faith and trust in him. Let him in.

During the Communion Rite while the people sing the "Lamb of God," the priest puts a small particle of the Body of Christ into the Blood of Christ in the chalice. During this, he says, "May this mingling of the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ bring eternal life to us who receive it."

This is what we receive and are promised in Holy Communion.

## THE COMMUNION RITE

### *Preparation for Communion*

Since the Eucharistic Celebration is the Paschal Banquet, it is desirable that in keeping with the Lord's command, his Body and Blood should be received as spiritual food by the faithful who are properly disposed. This is the sense of the fraction and the other preparatory rites by which the faithful are led directly to Communion.

#### The Lord's Prayer

In the Lord's Prayer a petition is made for daily food, which for Christians means preeminently the Eucharistic bread, and also for purification from sin, so that what is holy may, in fact, be given to those who are holy. The priest says the invitation to the prayer, and all the faithful say it with him; the priest alone adds the embolism, which the people conclude with a doxology. The embolism, enlarging upon the last petition of the Lord's Prayer itself, begs deliverance from the power of evil for the entire community of the faithful.

#### The Rite of Peace

The Rite of Peace follows, by which the Church asks for peace and unity for herself and for the whole human family, and the faithful express to each other their ecclesial communion and mutual charity before communicating in the Sacrament.

#### The Fraction

The priest breaks the Eucharistic Bread, assisted, if the case calls for it, by the deacon or a concelebrant. Christ's gesture of breaking bread at the Last Supper, which gave the entire Eucharistic Action its name in apostolic times, signifies that the many faithful are made one body (1 Corinthians 10:17) by receiving Communion from the one Bread of Life which is Christ, who died and rose for the salvation of the world.



The fraction or breaking of bread is begun after the sign of peace and is carried out with proper reverence, though it should not be unnecessarily prolonged, nor should it be accorded undue importance.

The priest breaks the Bread and puts a piece of the host into the chalice to signify the unity of the Body and Blood of the Lord in the work of salvation, namely, of the living and glorious Body of Jesus Christ.

The supplication *Agnus Dei*, is, as a rule, sung by the choir or cantor with the congregation responding; or it is, at least, recited aloud. This invocation accompanies the fraction and, for this reason, may be repeated as many times as necessary until the rite has reached its conclusion, the last time ending with the words *dona nobis pacem* (*grant us peace*).
