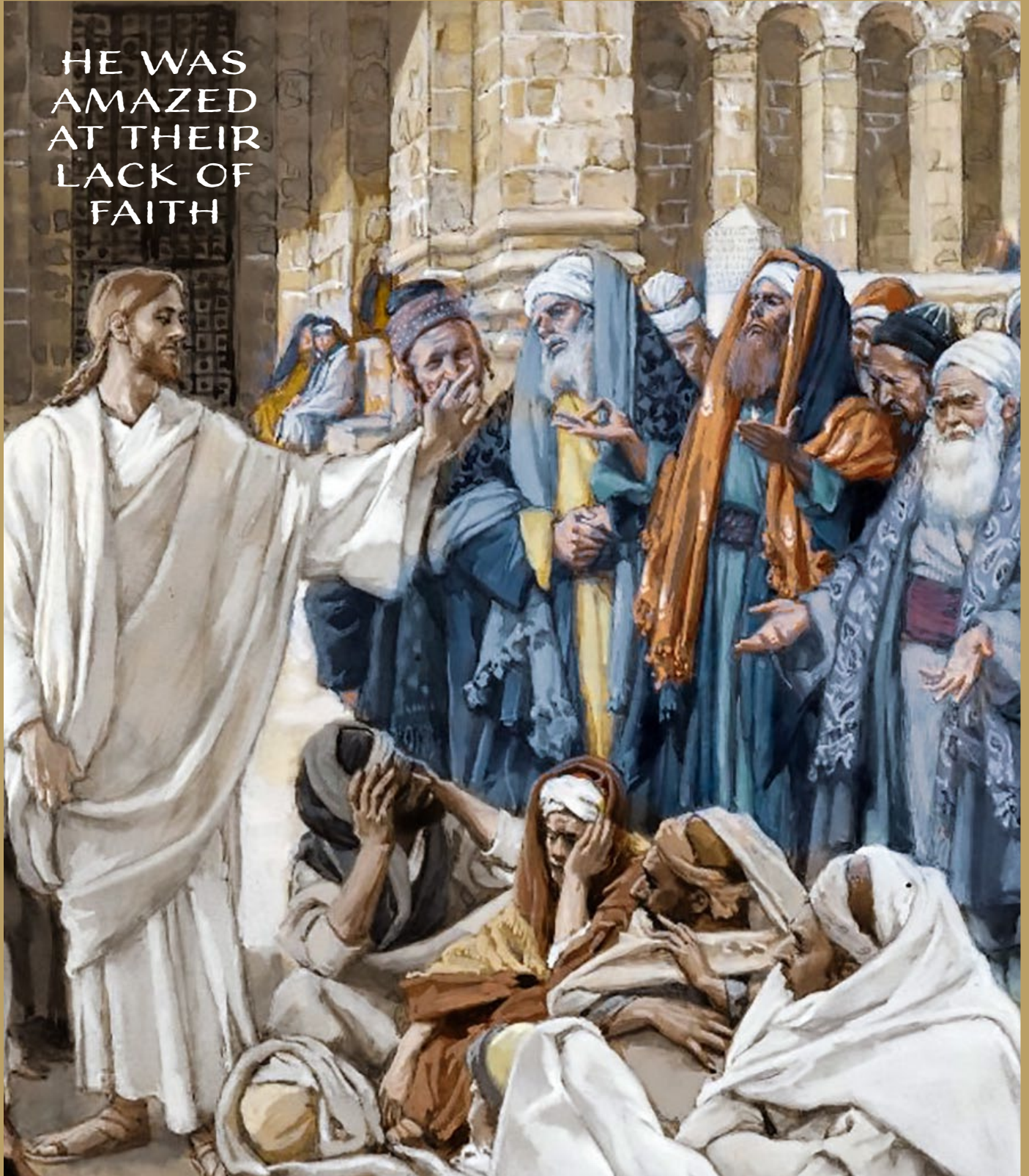

Pastor's corner

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Happy Fourth of July! The Declaration of Independence was signed this day in 1776 by the representatives of the United States of America, in General Counsel, "We hold these truths self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness." I pray that our country will return to these self-evident Rights especially for the sake of the lives of babies in the womb.

Today is the Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. In the Gospel Reading today, Jesus returned "to his native place." Up to this point, everywhere he went, the people sang his praises. But that did not happen in Nazareth. They refused to believe that the kid from Nazareth was anything more than "the carpenter, the son of Mary" the relative of their neighbors. To them he was not a prophet, not the messiah, "they took offense at him." Jesus said, "A prophet is not without honor except in his native place and among his own kin and in his own house. ... He was amazed at their lack of faith." (See Mark 6:1-6)

Up to this point in the Gospel according to Mark, faith has been the theme of Jesus' preaching. Jesus said to the woman who had been hemorrhaging for twelve years who touched his cloak, "Daughter, your faith has saved you. Go in peace and be cured of your affliction" (Mark 5:34). To the synagogue official whose daughter had just died, he said, "Do not be afraid, just have faith" (Mark 5:36).

Jesus wants us to believe in him. In order to do this, we must let go of our disbelief, our refusal to believe, our "this doesn't make sense," our "unless I touch the wounds I will not believe."

No matter what you are going through, no matter what seems to be getting in the way of putting your faith in Jesus, the Son of God who became man, who died upon the Cross and rose from the dead, ask Jesus to dispel the darkness of unbelief, disbelief, and refusal to believe. Beg Jesus to give you faith, to strengthen your weak faith, to purify your foggy faith.

Parish Manager's update

Our summer construction projects continue to take shape. The asphalt repairs are completed and the resealing and the restriping are scheduled for July 28-30. In bigger news, we finally have all the approvals from the Diocese and from the City to start installation of the secondary safety fence that I talked about back on May 30th. As I mentioned at that time, the fence will replace the plastic red cones that have separated our students from vehicle traffic. The fence is similar to the fence we installed around the Hall. Virtually every diocesan school and virtually every local public school has this type of safety fence.

With approvals in hand, we are now working with the fence contractor to schedule his work around the schedule of the asphalt contractor. He has just ordered the material he needs for the project. If all goes well, the posts for the fence will be installed before the asphalt is resealed on July 28-30. After the reseat, the sections of the fence and the gates will be installed. Remember these gates should all be opened on the weekends but closed during the school day.

By the time you read this article, I should have pricing for most of our remaining parish summer projects. This includes pricing to replace the roof on the convent, to repair fascia board on several buildings, to repaint the exterior of the hall and the rectory, and to replace the cracked skylight above the tapestry in our church. These projects are all dependent on the cost of the work and the funds we have in our savings and checking account, not from money in our Building Fund.

Thank you, as always, for helping fund the many needs of our parish. As we can afford to do so, I believe in preventative maintenance to protect our parish facilities and to maintain or extend their life span.

Solidarity in Freedom

Religious freedom allows the Church, and all religious communities, to live out their faith in public and to serve the good of all. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) invites Catholics to pray, reflect, and act to promote religious freedom.

What is the Equality Act and why should I care?

The Equality Act (H.R. 5 / S. 393) is a bill in Congress that supporters claim is necessary to protect people who self-identify as LGBT from discrimination. All people should be treated with respect, sensitivity, and compassion. In truth, people who identify as LGBT have often suffered unjust discrimination. We Catholics should consider how we can build a more just society for all people. However, the bill would do much more harm than good, to Catholics and non-Catholics alike. Here are some examples, both of direct effects and of other possible consequences that some advocates, courts, and government agencies could create when they interpret and enforce the Act:

- It would likely require taxpayers to fund elective abortions.
- It would likely force doctors and hospitals to perform abortions.
- It would likely require employers with more than 14 employees to cover abortions in their insurance plans.
- It would restrict people who are struggling with their gender—including children and teens—

from accessing needed help in loving themselves and their bodies.

- It would mandate that doctors and counselors perform and promote life-altering gender “transitions.”
- It would require even religious organizations to cover gender “transition” procedures in their employee health insurance plans.
- It would force girls and women to compete against males in school sports.
- It would force girls and women to share locker rooms, gym showers, restrooms, and dorms with males who self-identify as girls or women.
- It would force vulnerable, sometimes traumatized, girls and women in shelters or social services programs to share sleeping, shower, and other spaces with men.
- It would shut down Catholic foster care and adoption agencies for protecting the children’s rights to be in a home with a married mother and father.
- It would mandate that schools fully embrace and impose some children’s “gender identity” on other children.

- It could make schools change their curriculum to falsely teach children that they can change their sex, and that having same-sex sexual relationships are the only way for some of them to be healthy.

- It could close Catholic girls’ schools and boys’ schools or make them co-ed.

- It could put parents’ custody over their own children at risk by sending a powerful signal to the state governments that the only kind of people fit to be parents are those who give unquestioning affirmation to LGBT self-identification.

- It would force small businesspeople, such as wedding or event vendors and custom product makers, to support events that violate their beliefs or be put out of business.

- It could force some church-owned halls and properties to host same-sex ceremonies and other events that violate the venues’ faith, and require them to open restrooms to the opposite sex.

- It would reinforce efforts to strip churches, and religious schools, hospitals, and other charities of their federal tax exemptions.

- It would prohibit free and truthful speech by requiring everyone to use “preferred pronouns” and show support for gender “transition” in workplaces, schools, and more.

The Equality Act attacks religious freedom by making itself a special exception to the bipartisan Religious Freedom Restoration Act, which has never been done before. It would, in sum, make people reject the truth that human beings are created male and female, with the family formed by a married couple as the first building block of society. —[usccb.org/committees/religious-liberty/stopping-equality-act-key-points-and-steps](https://www.usccb.org/committees/religious-liberty/stopping-equality-act-key-points-and-steps)

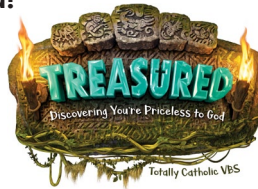

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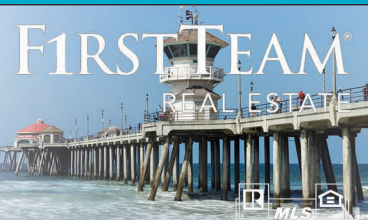
