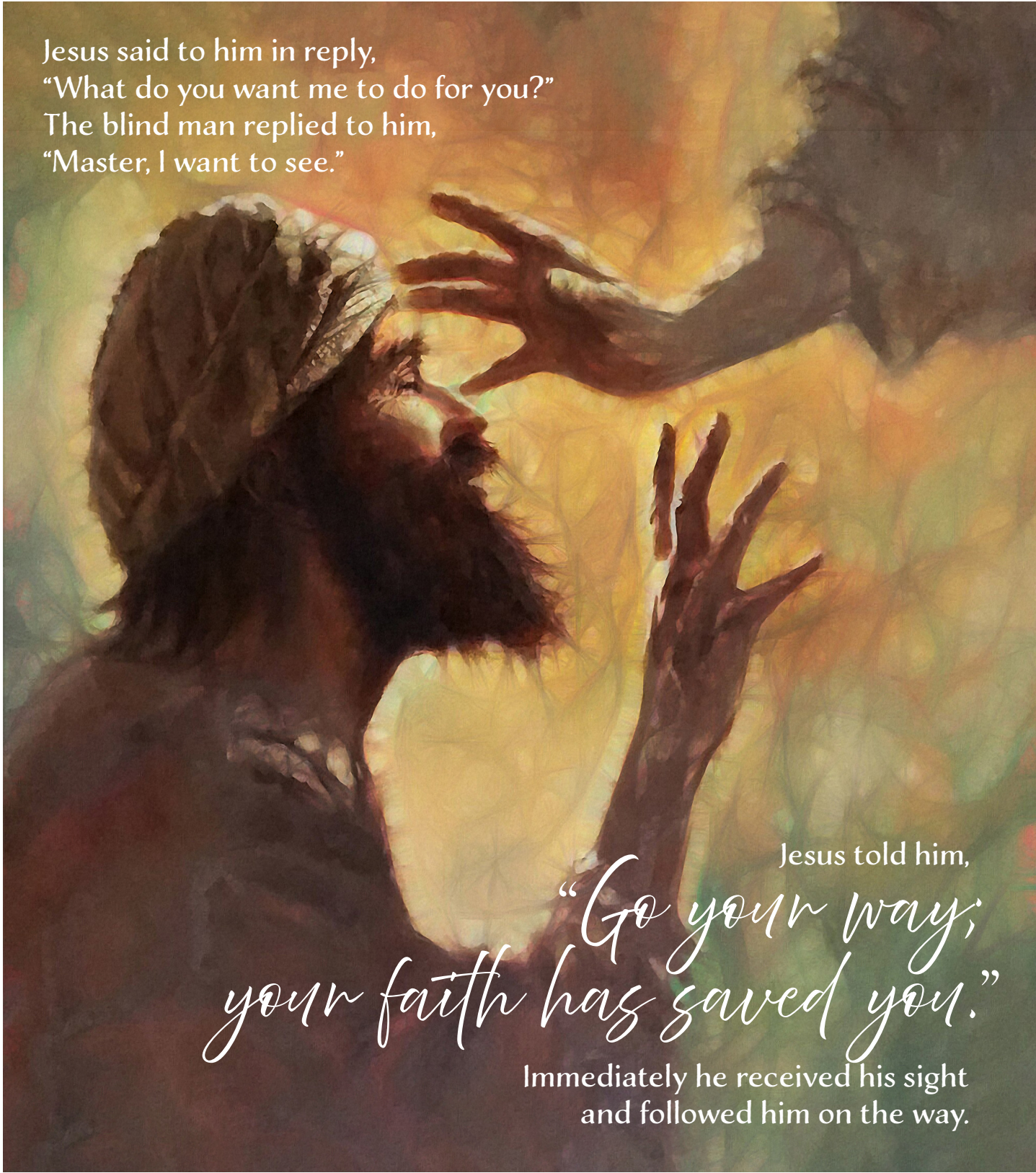

Pastor's corner

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The First Reading this Sunday is from the Book of the Prophet Jeremiah. (Jeremiah 31:7-9) The Prophet gives hope to the Israelites that they will be released from exile in Assyria, "The Lord has delivered his people, the remnant of Israel. ... I will gather them from the ends of the world, with the blind and the lame in their midst, the mothers and those with child; they shall return as an immense throng." Typically, a long journey like this would be too difficult for the pregnant, as well as the blind and the lame. However, everybody, no matter what their condition, will be able to return to their homeland, "on a level road, so that none shall stumble."

Today's Responsorial Psalm 126 echoes this, "When the Lord brought back the captives of Zion, we were like men dreaming. Then our mouth was filled with laughter, and our tongue with rejoicing." Together we sing, "The Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy."

In the Gospel Reading today, there is a person who is blind who will sing for joy (Mark 10:46-52). Bartimaeus heard that Jesus was passing by. He cried out, "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me." People traveling with Jesus told the blind man to be silent. But he cried out louder, "Son of David, have pity on me." Jesus said, "Call him." So, they told him, "Take courage; get up, Jesus is calling you." I am intrigued by the next sentence, "He [the blind man] threw aside his cloak, sprang up, and came to Jesus." I am 67 years old. If I was on the ground like the blind man, I would slowly get up to a standing position. My body doesn't let me "spring up" any longer. My spring has sprung. What's the point I'm making? The blind man was most likely a young man facing a lifetime of blindness. All the more reason why he cried out, "Jesus, have pity on me!"

Jesus asked him, "What do you want me to do for you?" The man said, "Master, I want to see." Now, of course, we are thinking that he wanted to see with his physical eyes. However, there is something deeper he wanted. As an example, let me tell a story. A teacher was trying to help her class understand a difficult math problem. She tried different approaches, but her students still didn't get it. She tried a different approach and then some students said, "Oh, I 'see' what you mean." They were able to "understand" the problem. Their eyes were opened.

Notice that when the blind man received his sight, he didn't just thank Jesus and leave. The newly sighted man "followed" Jesus on the way. He wanted to get to know Jesus deeply. He wanted to understand him. He wanted to see him. He became his disciple. It took a man who could not see with his physical eyes to see Jesus with eyes of faith. James and John saw Jesus as someone who could help them move up the ladder of prestige. The disciples were more concerned about who was the greatest even as Jesus told them that he would suffer and die. The man who could not see with his physical eyes asked something from Jesus that had deep value. He did not want to be the greatest like the disciple did. He did not demand to sit by his throne like James and John. He asked to see Jesus. And that's exactly what we need to do.

Lord, remove our blindness. Open our eyes to really see you with eyes of faith, to really know you. Help us to follow you to the Cross, to the Resurrection, to eternal life. Together we sing, "The Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy."

Parish Manager's update

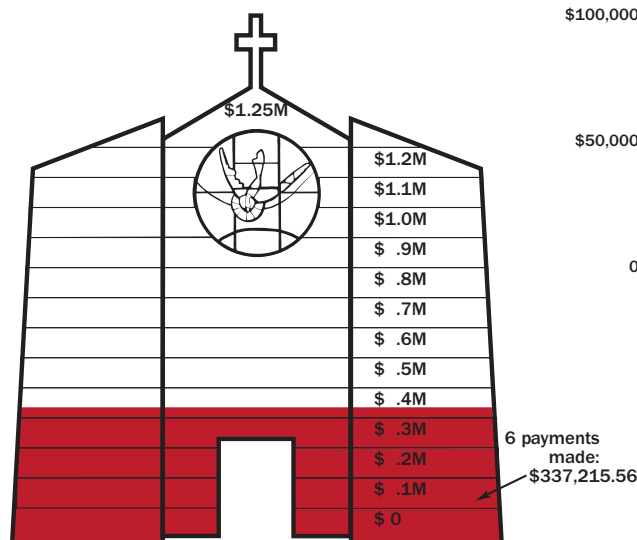

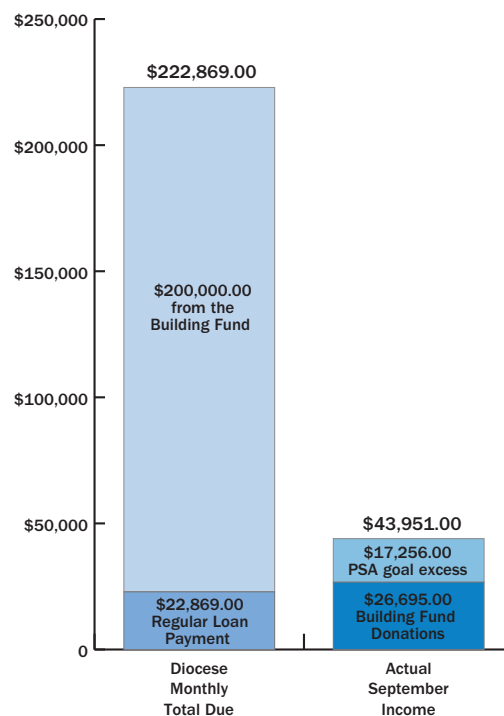

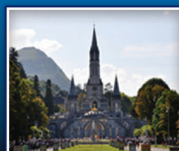
