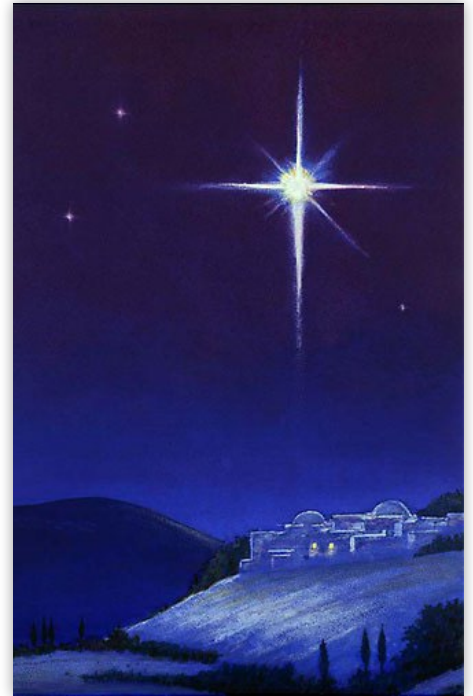




Pastor's corner

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This Sunday we celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord. "Epiphany" means manifestation. The Son of God manifested or revealed himself. In the Gospel according to Matthew, we are told that the magi from the east looked to the stars and recognized that something special was happening in the land of the Jews. The magi traveled to the Jewish capital of Jerusalem and asked, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage." Even though the magi, also known as wisemen, were overjoyed, King Herod "was greatly troubled, and all Jerusalem with him" (Matthew 2:2-12). Why were Herod and the people of Jerusalem troubled? Herod was not going to allow a rival to take his throne. He needed to eliminate this newborn rival. The people were worried that the Romans would view this new king as a challenge to Caesar's authority. They had heard what happened in other kingdoms when the people revolted against the Romans. The Roman Army had destroyed those kingdoms and the people had been exiled to Rome.



However, our Lord Jesus Christ wasn't coming to take away anyone's kingdom, he was coming to take away sin and evil. He was coming to bring eternal life. He was coming to save not just one nation, he was coming to save all people. Again, we hear in the Gospel of Matthew that the angel appeared to Joseph in a dream, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home. For it is through the Holy Spirit that this child has been conceived in her. She will bear a son and you are to name him Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins" (Matthew 1:18-21).

We rejoice that the Son of God revealed himself to all. Our Savior has come to bring eternal life to all people. St. Paul wrote to the Ephesians, "It was not made known to people in other generations as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles by the Spirit: that the Gentiles are coheirs, members of the same body, and copartners in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel" (Ephesians 3:4-6). When St. Paul uses the term "Gentiles" he was referring to non-Jewish people. Therefore, we are called to salvation in Jesus Christ the Son of God who became man.

As we begin this new year, let us rejoice in the Epiphany of Jesus Christ. Let us see him revealed in Holy Scripture. Let us see him revealed in his Body and Blood in the Holy Eucharist. Let us see him manifested in the forgiveness of the Sacrament of Penance (Confession/Reconciliation). Let us see him manifested in many wonderful and mysterious ways.

"Behold, the virgin shall be with child and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel, which means God is with us" (Matthew 1:21-22).

Parish Manager's update

Happy New Year! We've come a long way since January of 2021. Last January, our Masses were all held outside, the parish offices were physically closed, meetings were via Zoom, sacraments were limited, public prayer and devotion were limited, etc. Now, January of 2022, we are back in our church for everything we did prior to the start of the pandemic. The final item to return were the votive candles, which returned a few weeks ago. As a reminder, envelopes to request a votive candle are available at the parish center.



We also were able to perform some much-needed repairs to our facilities during the past year, because of your generous donations. Remember, these repairs were not paid for by our Building Fund. They were paid from your donations in the Sunday collection and online giving. We were able to repair fascia board, repaint the exterior of the hall and rectory, reroof the convent, repair and repave and restripe the parking lot. This year we hope we can paint the interior and exterior of the convent and the interior of the rectory. We also hope to give the planters on Springdale some much needed attention. Our school also has a list of needed maintenance and repairs for summer. Overall, we have a property that is almost 9 acres in size, with nearly 80,000 square feet of buildings. That would be the equivalent of about 40 homes (at 2,000' each). We have to care for our facilities to help avoid expensive repairs.

Another big difference this January is our overall Mass attendance, which is now twice what it was last year. While we may have different opinions about all things COVID, Mass attendance is increasing. Clearly some parishioners are still concerned about large crowds, etc., but in the past year, many of you have addressed your concerns, at least enough to attend Mass in our beautiful church. I truly hope to see our Mass attendance continue to increase along with participation in our many ministries.

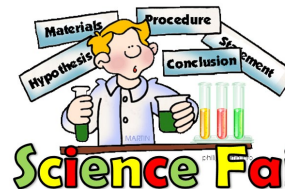

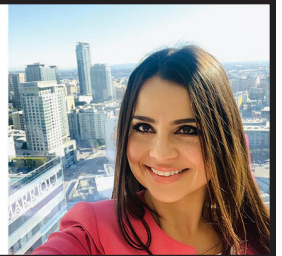
