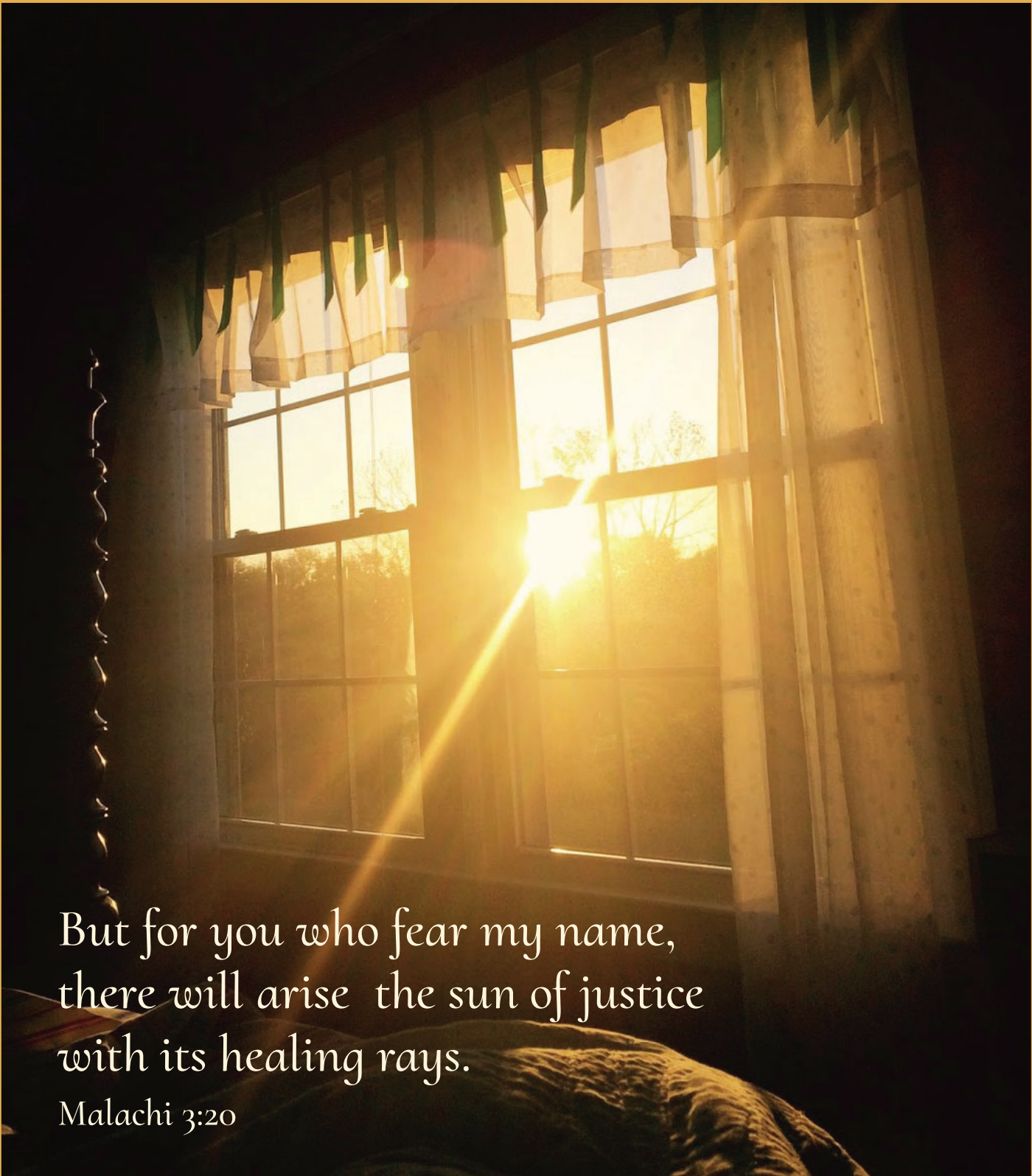

PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

There are different types of years. There are calendar years, fiscal years, and insurance years. The Church also has a year, called the Liturgical Year. It begins with the First Sunday of Advent and concludes with the Thirty-fourth week in Ordinary Time. Today we celebrate the Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time, so the Liturgical Year is almost over. As the Liturgical Year approaches its end, the Church reflects on the End Times when our Lord Jesus Christ will come again in glory.

The early Church thought Jesus was coming again in their lifetime. As the first generation of Christians started dying, the Church realized that "the when" of our Lord's return in glory is up to God the Father and not the members of the Church. Our Lord Jesus Christ might return in the next hour or a thousand years from now. In today's Gospel Reading, Jesus said, "See that you not be deceived, for many will come in my name, saying, 'I am he,' and 'The time has come.' Do not follow them!" Today's Gospel Reading ends with Jesus saying, "By your perseverance you will secure your lives." (Read Luke 21:5-19) Each new day is another opportunity to prepare for the coming of the Lord through our love of God and our love of neighbor.

Down through the ages, some people were convinced the End Times were at hand. When the Temple in Jerusalem was destroyed by the Romans in 70 A.D., people thought the end was near. The same could be said for the Black Death (a.k.a. the Great Mortality) that between 1347 and 1349, killed almost half the population of Europe. World War I killed 40 million. World War II killed 70 to 85 million. This includes civilians and military casualties. And yet the ultimate end did not come. I could also go into the devastation that nuclear and thermo-nuclear armaments could cause. However, what is most important is that we turn to the Lord. We must pray for peace. We must pray for respect for life. We must live lives of peace and justice.

In the first chapter of the Gospel according to Luke, Zechariah, filled with the Holy Spirit, prophesied about his son, St. John the Baptist, "You my child, shall be prophet of the Most High; for you will go before the Lord to prepare his way, to give his people knowledge of salvation by the forgiveness of their sins." (Luke 1:76-77) Then Zechariah prophesied about the First Coming of Jesus Christ, "In the tender compassion of our God, the dawn from on high shall break upon us, to shine on those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death, and to guide our feet into the way of peace." (Luke 1:78-79) This is what we are called to do as we prepare ourselves every day for the Second Coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. Please allow the Lord to guide you into the way of peace.

I would like to end with the prayer that the priest prays after the Our Father at Mass:

Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil, graciously grant peace in our days, that, by the help of your mercy, we may be always free from sin and safe from all distress, as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ. —*Roman Missal, The Order of Mass, #125*

ANNIVERSARY BLESSING November 12-13

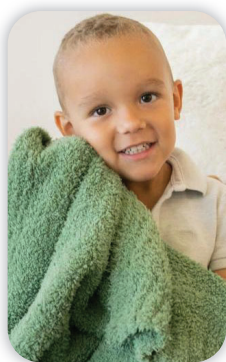
This weekend we will have a special blessing at all Sunday Masses for those celebrating a wedding anniversary in the month of November.

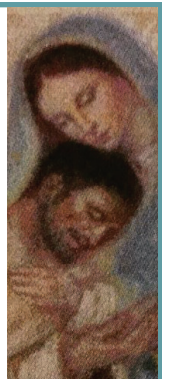
AWAITING PURE LOVE

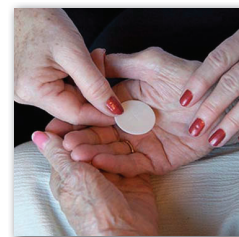

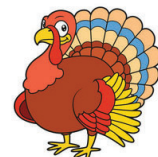

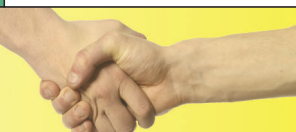
