Farewell Letter from Fr. Ruben



My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ, how are you all doing?

If I were to try to find a scripture verse that could summarize my time here at St. Bonaventure, what would it be? Well in a big way, but not exclusively, I would say it's ...

1 Corinthians 12:12-27 As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ. For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, slaves or free persons, and we were all given to drink of one Spirit. Now the body is not a single part, but many. If a foot should say, "Because I am not a hand I do not belong to the body," it does not for this reason belong any less to the body. Or if an ear should say, "Because I am not an eye I do not belong to the body," it does not for this reason belong any less to the body.

If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be? If the whole body were hearing, where would the sense of smell be? But as it is, God placed the parts, each one of them, in the body as he intended. If they were all one part, where would the body be? But as it is, there are many parts, yet one body. The eye cannot say to the hand, "I do not need you," nor again the head to the feet, "I do not need you." Indeed, the parts of the body that seem to be weaker are all the more necessary, and those parts of the body that we consider less honorable we surround with greater honor, and our less presentable parts are treated with greater propriety, whereas our more presentable parts do not need this. But God has so constructed the body as to give greater honor to a part that is without it, so that there may be no division in the body, but that the parts may have the same concern for one another. If [one] part suffers, all the parts suffer with it; if one part is honored, all the parts share its joy. Now you are Christ's body, and individually parts of it.

I was ordained to the priesthood 11 years ago and way back then I did not know what I have come to experience and know now. All I understood back then was I was to be a priest for the people of God and serve them in the celebration of Mass and in the administration of the sacraments. I had read this scripture verse before and through my prior experience of being a lector, Eucharistic Minister, and Minister to the Sick could not fully appreciate it in a more profound way. I did not fully understand how we are all together on a great journey of faith, and how much we really do rely on each other to grow in the love of God and each other. During my time here, I have really seen how you, my brothers and sisters in Christ, really and truly have faith, how you truly do believe in God and through your words and actions, demonstrate it in so many ways. You have been my inspiration; you have helped me to see that what I said yes to 11 years ago really matters, and how important my role is as a priest called to serve you. We all have a part to play on our journey of faith. Without those called to be preachers, catechists, teachers, sacristans, Eucharistic Ministers, ushers, altar servers, hospitality ministers, and priests, just to name a few, where would we be?

I have seen how many of you are always ready, willing and able to say Yes to whatever needs to be done to support and continue our mission of bringing the message of salvation to all. Thank you for saying Yes, a great reminder as to why I continue to say Yes. They used to tell us in the seminary that the people love and help form their priests, I have come to understand how true this is by serving you and others in my prior assignments. Thank you for letting me be a part of your journey of faith. You have been a great inspiration in my ministry. As I move on to my new assignment, I ask you to pray for me as I will continue to pray for you.

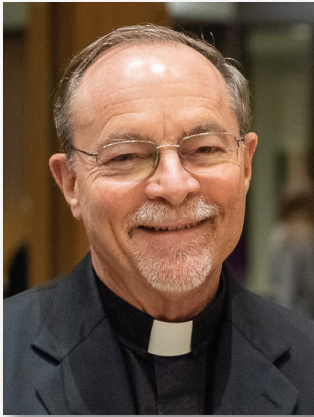

Q&A

Continued from the June 16 bulletin

Q: What is the Ordinariate and how is it different from the Pastoral Provision?

A: The Personal Ordinariate of the Chair of St Peter, also simply known as the Ordinariate, was established on January 1, 2012, by Pope Benedict XVI. The Ordinariate is separate and distinct from the Pastoral Provision. The Ordinariate oversees individuals, parishes, priests, and religious communities that wish to use the Book of Divine Worship, an adaptation of the American Book of Common Prayer. It preserves along with the Book of Divine Worship, Anglican traditions, and customs. Former Protestant ministers who apply to the Pastoral Provision, desire to be ordained as Roman Catholic priests of the Latin Rite in their local Latin Rite diocese, celebrating the Latin Rite liturgy.

Q: Does this mean that the Catholic Church will begin ordaining married men on a regular basis?

A: No. The ordination of a married man remains an exception and one that is granted only in specific cases involving men who had already been called to ministry in another church or Christian denomination and later came into full communion in the Catholic Church.

Q: Is this practice of married priests common in the United States?

A: In the United States, it is relatively uncommon but notable that over 300 married former Protestant ministers, originating from Episcopalian, Lutheran, Presbyterian or Methodist

backgrounds have transitioned to serve as Catholic priests. These individuals experienced a calling to join the Catholic Church, underwent a formal process to enter into full communion with their families and received permission from Rome to be ordained as Catholic priests. They are now active in their priestly ministries throughout the country.

Q: Has this practice evolved?

A: Yes. Originally, this practice only applied to men who had been Episcopalian/Anglican clergy. It also involved the situation of whole parishes coming into full communion along with their ministers. They were permitted to use adapted liturgical practices borrowed from their Episcopalian roots. Over the years, petitions from ministers of other Protestant denominations were considered and permissions granted.

Q: Why does the Catholic Church ordain them if they were already ministers in their own denominations?

A: The Catholic Church does not recognize the ordinations of Protestant ministers. However, it does recognize the priesthood ordinations of Eastern Orthodox, Oriental Orthodox, and Assyrian Church of the East priests and the priestly ordinations of the Polish National Catholic Church.

Q: If these men were trained to be ministers in another denomination, how can we be assured that what they teach and preach is truly Catholic?

A: Men seeking to be ordained under these provisions undergo a theological evaluation. A team of experts evaluates their knowledge of seven subjects. Among the areas tested are Ascetical Theology, Canon Law, Church History,

Dogmatic Theology, Liturgical and Sacramental Theology, Moral Theology, and Sacred Scripture. Each candidate is criminal background checked and must pass a psychiatric evaluation. If married with a family, the marriage and family life must be evidenced as stable and healthy. Based on this, a prescribed plan of studies is assigned on a case-by-case basis. After the syllabus is completed, the candidate is required to pass all exams.

Q: Is it up to the diocesan bishop to make the final decision to admit the candidate to Holy Orders?

A: The diocesan bishop is required to present the case to the Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith at the Vatican. A dossier of required documents is submitted, including a petition for a dispensation from the impediment of marriage that stands in the way of the ordination to priesthood. The actual dispensation can only be granted by the Holy Father.

Q: Does this mean that the Catholic Church will now allow priests to marry or that priests who left the ministry to marry will be able to return to priestly ministry?

A: No. The Church has no tradition of allowing someone to marry after ordination. In fact, should one of the married priests become widowed, he is not permitted to marry again. Also, in keeping with long Tradition, a married priest is not eligible to be ordained a bishop in Catholic or Orthodox Churches.

Mc 3,20-35 "Người là ai mà cả gió lẫn biển cũng đều vâng lệnh Người".

Anh chị em thân mến trong Chúa Kitô,

Xin gửi lời hỏi thăm đến tất cả mọi người.

Nếu cần tìm một đoạn Thánh Kinh để tóm tắt thời gian tôi ở Giáo Xứ St. Bonaventure, thì phải chọn đoạn Thánh Kinh nào? Thời được, tôi xin chọn đoạn này:

Côrintô 12:12-14, 27 – Như thân xác là một, mà có nhiều chi thể, và tất cả các chi thể tuy nhiều, nhưng chỉ là một thân xác, thì Chúa Kitô cũng vậy. Vì chung, trong một Thánh Thần, tất cả chúng ta chịu phép rửa để làm thành một thân xác, cho dầu Do Thái hay Hilạp, tự do hay nô lệ, và tất cả chúng ta cùng uống trong một Thánh Thần. Vì thân xác không chỉ gồm một chi thể, mà là nhiều chi thể. Phần anh chị em, anh chị em là thân xác Chúa Kitô và là chi thể Người, mỗi người có phận sự mình.

Tôi được thụ phong linh mục cách đây 11 năm. Vào lúc đó tôi không biết mình sẽ trải qua những gì nhưng bây giờ thì đã biết. Vào lúc bấy giờ tôi chỉ biết là mình làm linh mục phục vụ dân Chúa và lo việc cử hành Thánh Lễ và các bí tích. Tôi đã đọc đoạn Thánh Kinh này trước đây, và trải qua kinh nghiệm của một thừa tác viên lời Chúa, TTV Thánh thể, và đưa Minh Thánh cho bệnh nhân, tôi không có được một cảm nghiệm trọn vẹn như bây giờ. Tôi không hiểu được ý nghĩa của việc chúng ta cùng nhau trong cuộc hành trình đức tin vĩ đại, và chúng ta cần đến nhau như thế nào để tiến triển trong tình yêu của Thiên Chúa và với nhau. Trong thời gian ở đây, tôi thực sự nhìn thấy anh chị em trong Chúa Kitô, là những người tin tưởng vào Thiên Chúa. Lời nói và hành động của anh chị em đã thể hiện niềm tin đó. Chính anh chị em là nguồn cảm hứng cho tôi và giúp tôi hiểu được điều mà tôi đã xin vâng 11 năm trước đây, và hiểu được vai trò quan trọng của tôi là phục vụ anh chị em. Mỗi người chúng ta đều có một vai trò trong cuộc hành trình đức tin. Nếu không có những người được mời gọi để làm thầy giảng dạy, giảng viên giáo lý, phục vụ phòng thánh, TTV Thánh Thể, ban trật tự, giúp lễ, tiếp đón, linh mục, vv, chúng ta sẽ ra sao?

Tôi thấy nhiều anh chị em luôn sẵn sàng xin vâng để phục vụ và hỗ trợ cho sứ vụ rao giảng sứ điệp ơn cứu độ cho tất cả mọi người. Cảm ơn quý vị đã sẵn sàng xin vâng để nhắc nhở tôi lý do tại sao tôi xin vâng. Khi còn ở chủng viện, nhiều người nói với tôi là giáo dân yêu thương và nâng đỡ các linh mục. Tôi đã hiểu được điều này khi phục vụ anh chị em và những giáo dân khác trong những nhiệm sở trước đây. Chân thành cảm ơn anh chị em đã cho tôi được làm một phần trong cuộc hành trình đức tin của anh chị em. Quý vị là nguồn cảm hứng tuyệt vời trong đời sống mục vụ của tôi. Khi chuyển sang nhiệm sở mới, xin quý vị cầu nguyện cho tôi và tôi cũng sẽ tiếp tục cầu nguyện cho quý vị.

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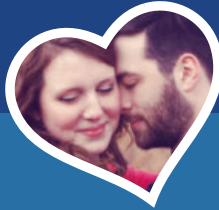
